Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Smith left for a short time.

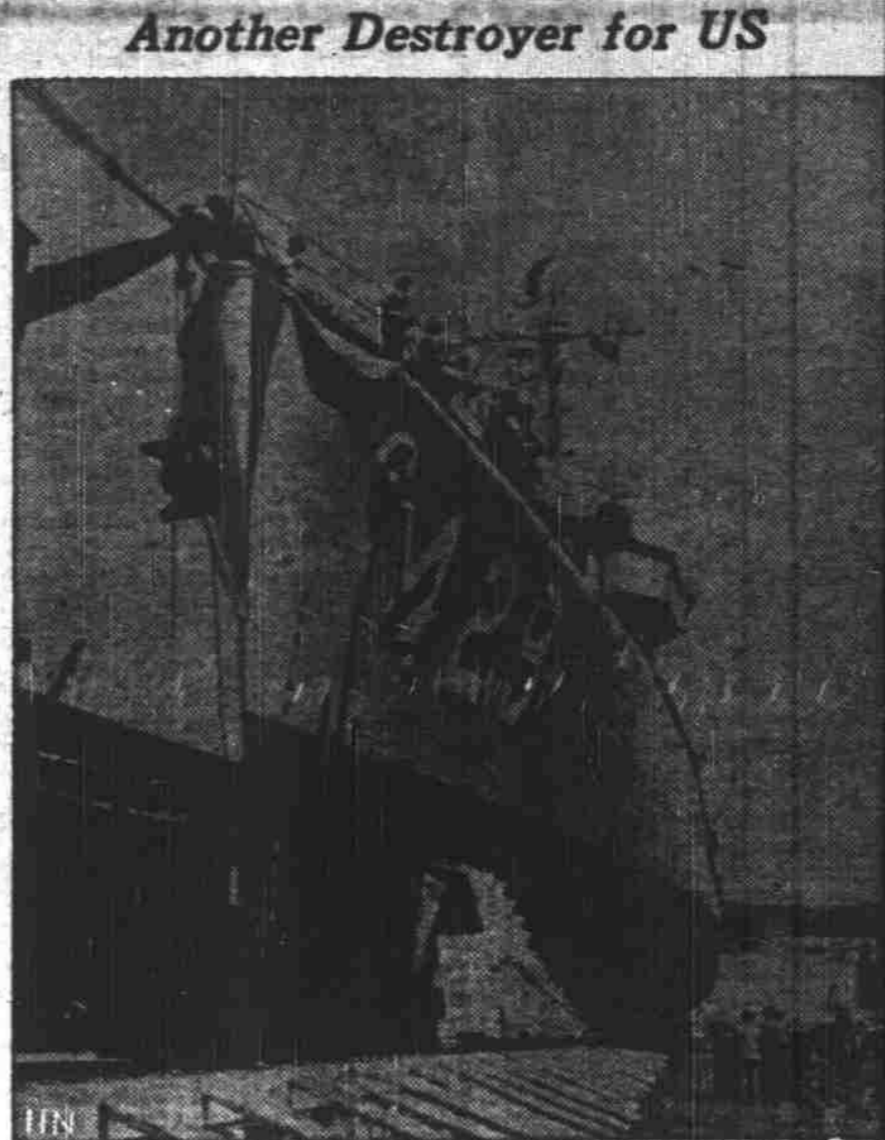
Second Laymen's Retreat Planned
