

Market's Rise Halted Today

Possible Hitler Invasion of England Causes Withdrawals
NEW YORK, Sept. 11-(AP)—A quiet advance in the stock market was brought to an abrupt halt today by Prime Minister Churchill's warning that Hitler could be expected to attempt the invasion of England within a week.

Traders, who for nearly four hours had been pushing prices higher by fractions to full points, suddenly decided to withdraw from action, perhaps to await the actual attack.
When the final bell sounded, The Associated Press average of 60 selected stocks was off .1 of a point at 4.55, a figure 4 of a point lower than the noonday standing.

Wheat Recovers With Slight up

Increased Air Raids Chill Bright Prospects; Close Above Wednesday's
CHICAGO, Sept. 11-(P)—The wheat market's recovery was extended today but price gains that amounted to as much as a cent a bushel at one time were reduced materially before the close.

Strength in securities and reports of improved Canadian export business with Great Britain and Portugal as well as better feeling about the war situation, despite having being wrought in London, helped to lift prices. The warning of Premier Churchill of an early German attempt at invasion and Berlin threats of increased air attacks chilled buying sentiment in final dealings, however.
Wheat closed 1/4-1/2 higher than yesterday, September 7 1/2, December 7 3/4.

AAA May Extend Winter Seed Aid

Oregon Farmers Will Have Expanded Market if so; Especially in Vetch
OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Sept. 12 — If the AAA extends its present grant of aid program for winter legume seed to other states, including Arkansas, Oregon farmers will have a greatly expanded market for the seed of vetch and peas — particularly vetch. This is the report sent back from Little Rock, Ark., by G. R. Hyslop, head of the plant industries division at Oregon State college, who has gone there to study future market possibilities and results being obtained with Oregon seed.

There is no question in my mind but that Oregon could double its hairy vetch acreage with a continuation and expansion of the grant of aid program in the south," said Hyslop. "A grant of aid program would establish a large business in vetch quickly. Otherwise the program will develop slowly."
