The past seven years he has lived in Linn county. He followed farming as an occupation, was a member of the Woodmen of the World, being a charter member of the organization and was also a member of Western Star grade of the Marion Presbyterian church.

On January 20, 1896, Mr. Doerfler married Rosa Amy White at Lewiston, Idaho. She died on April 13, 1913. Surviving are two sons, Lee Doerfler and Orville Doerfler both of Albany, and eight grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.
