

Willamette's Bearcats Meet Marines Here Next Friday Night

Keene Alternates Tailback Quartet

Stewart, McGinn, Furno, Reynolds See Service; Ogdahl Blocks Well

Possibility that Headman Speer Keene may alternate four tailbacks against the San Diego Marines, whom the Bearcats play here next Friday night in their first home game of the season, loomed strong in last week's heavy drills on Sweetland.

These alternates would include Gene Stewart, who appears to have almost enched the starting nod over George McGinn; Buddy Reynolds, star of the San Jose State game; Chuck Furno, diminutive freshman who is showing a world of promise; and McGinn, who so far hasn't hit the stride that stamped him one of the hardest running backs in the northwest the last two seasons.

Ogdahl Clinches Job Freshman Ted Ogdahl apparently has clinched the right half-back position. His blocking during the week was of a calibre that gained the coaching staff's stamp of approval, and he has repeatedly demonstrated that he is one of the most powerful runners on the squad.

Ogdahl and Al Walden, the little wriggle whose punting has featured Willamette play thus far this season, have paired in blocking roles for each other to good advantage.

The Marines, who are coming via two marine corps naval planes, are expected to land here sometime Thursday. It is planned to have a welcoming party, consisting of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion and auxiliary organizations, on hand to greet and entertain them.

Willamette's part of the entertainment is expected to begin at 8 o'clock Friday night, game time.

Navy Flows Over Princeton, 12-6

PRINCETON, N.J., Oct. 12.—(AP)—A Navy team that had been vastly underrated came with an irresistible rush in the second half today to beat the favored Princeton Tigers, 12 to 6, before 40,000 in Palmer stadium.

There was nothing fluky about the middies' triumph. They stamped themselves an eleven to be watched as they rolled to a 70 and 80 yards for touchdowns in the third period and were deprived of another by a goal-line fumble in the fourth.

In storming to their scores the middies displayed a set of brilliant running backs in Bill Blythe, Cliff Lenz and Howard Clark. Clark and Busk took turns passing more brilliantly than either of Princeton's famed tossers, Dave Allerdice and Bob Peters.

Bird Hunting Is Good, Reported

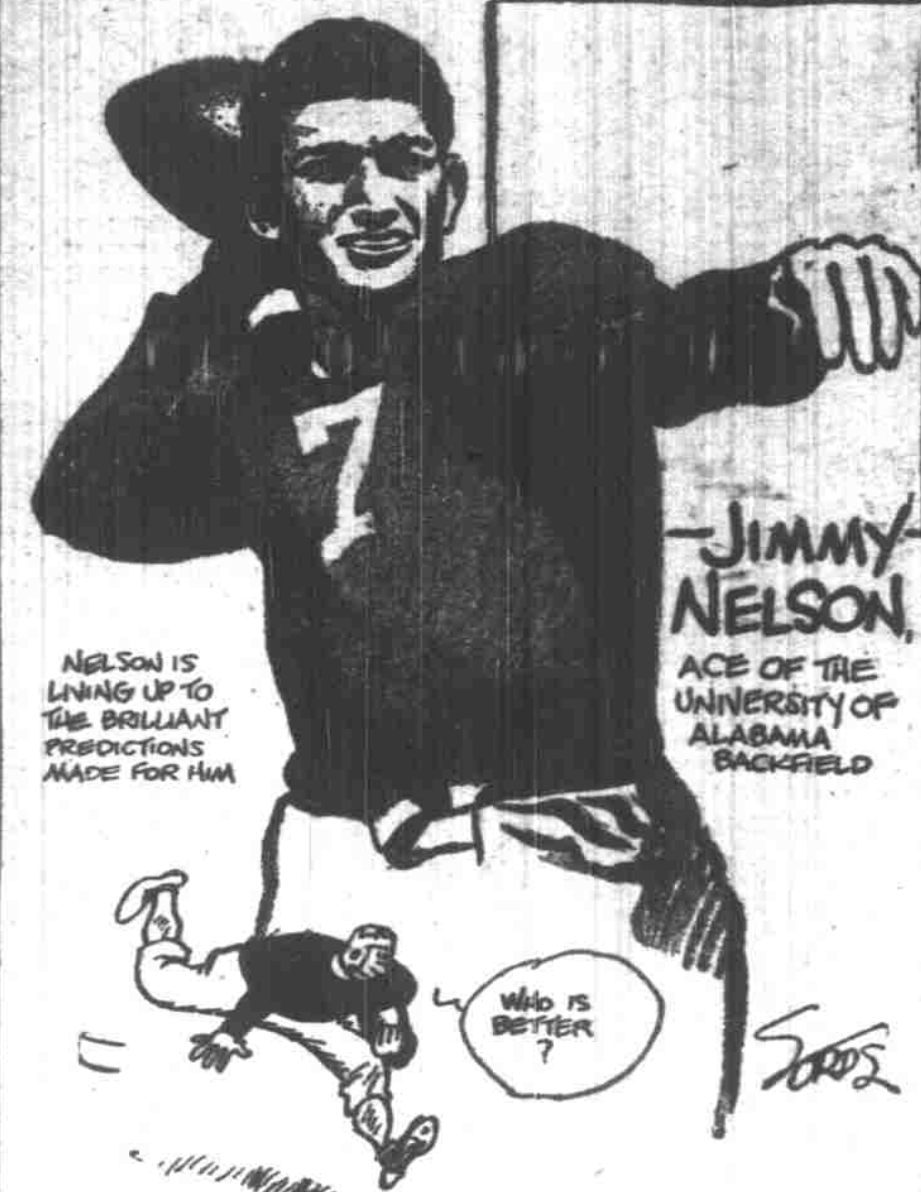
