Wheat Market Rallies Strong

Flour Prices Advance in Some Localities; Grain Is High at Close

CHICAGO, Oct. 31-(AP)-Buyers returned to the wheat pit in sufficlent numbers today to give prices their strongest rally since the reaction from the season's highs be-

Closing at the best levels of the session, wheat finished %-11/4 cents higher than yesterday, December 84 14-16, May 83 14-16.

Buying was stimulated by strength of securities and by improved demand attributed to consuming interests, although no large scale milling and baking trade was reported. Flour prices were advanced slightly in some lomuch of the strength to reinstatement of lines recently sold out to accept profits. They said the technical position of the market had been improved considerably by the setback.


