Here's a good main supper dish to delight the heart of the lady in the kitchen, who is trying to reconcile the family budget to main the holiday season: SALMON SCRAPPLE

pound canned salmon cup corn meal

2 cups water 1 1/2 teaspoons salt

1% cups milk 1 medium onion 1 carrot Pepper Measure meal into large sauce-

pan. Pour water over meal. Add salt and cook until thickened. Pour in milk and add salmon and vegetables that have been chopped fine. Season with pepper.
