

Series to Begin At First Baptist

Rev. Fox to Talk on World Events Beginning Sunday; Eight Talks Slated

A series of Sunday night services by Dr. Irving A. Fox, pastor of the First Baptist church, will begin Sunday night at 7:30 o'clock at the local church, Marion and Liberty streets.

Dr. Fox will include in his sermons comments "on the secret coming of Christ, fearful events now due, the alliance of the nations, the Antichrist, the startling end of the league and the coming of Christ as set forth in the Book of Revelation."

The complete series which will be illustrated by a large prophetic chart follows:

January 5, "Chapter 1—The Things Which John Saw, or a Glimpse into Heaven;" January 12, "Chapters 2 and 3—The Things Which Are or Prophecy Come True, The Church in Ephesus or Leaving the First Love;" January 19, "The Church in Smyrna or Judaised Christianity—The Martyr's Death, and the Crown of Life;" January 26, "The Church in Pergamos or the Union of the Church and the World, the Hidden Manna and the New Name."

N. C. Ernston Returns to Salem From Portland; Talks January 12

Elder N. C. Ernston, pastor of the Salem Seventh Day Adventist church, recently returned to the local church from Portland where he was pastor of the Central Seventh Day Adventist church, one of the largest which that denomination has in Oregon.

As former pastor of the old Salem church at Fifth and Gaines street, Elder Ernston was instrumental in the increased membership of that body to the point where the church was taxed beyond its capacity. Since that time, under the leadership of several pastors, a new church has been built at Hood and North Summer streets with a seating capacity of about 700.

Mr. Ernston will be remembered by Salem friends for his Sunday night lectures on world events, at which time he declared on the basis of Bible prophecy that there would be another world war and that capital and labor would clash.

On January 12 at 7:30 p. m. Mr. Ernston will give another of his world event lectures at which time he will answer the question, "Will Hitler or the Axis Powers Unite Europe Under One Political Head?"

They have been successful in the work as missionaries and are eager to return to minister to the native people.

Their son Richard, age 10, will return with them. In the Sunday service Rev. Carl Mischke will speak in the Zulu language and Mrs. Mischke will interpret. Both Mr. and Mrs. Mischke sing well and will favor the congregation with several special songs.

DESIGN FOR LIVING

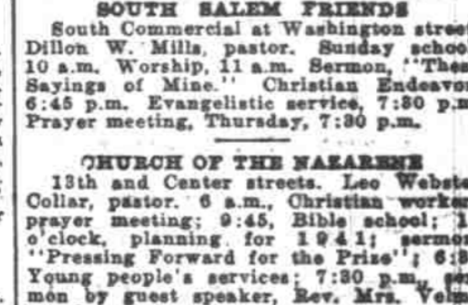

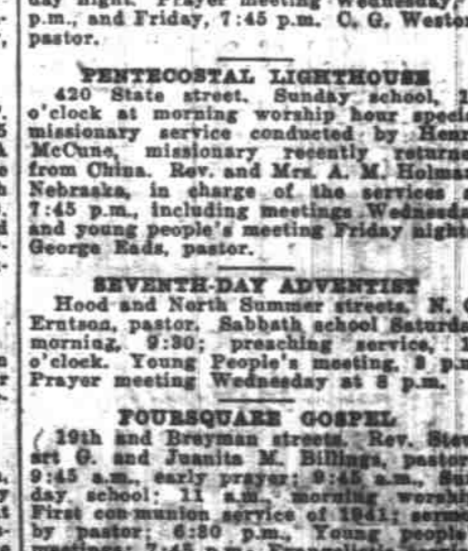
