Today's Menu

- Stuffed lamb shanks will be the day's main dish and the featured recipe for the dinner.
- Shredded carrot and beet salad
- Stuffed lamb shanks

- STUFFED LAMB SHANKS
- 5 lamb shanks
- 1 1/2 tablespoons fat
- 1 1/2 cups water
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- Scant teaspoon salt
- 1/4 pound barley
- Brown shanks in hot fat. Add water and season with salt and pepper. Cover and simmer until tender, about 1 1/2 hours. Remove meat from broth. When cool enough to handle, remove bones. Cook barley in broth, adding water as necessary. Stuff boned shanks with cooked barley. Place in kettle containing lamb broth. Thicken remaining lamb broth. Cover and heat thoroughly.

Combread Fine Recipe

There are as many cornbread recipes as there are good Southern cooks. Here is one of the many distinct types of cornbread, this one bordering on the custard, as it has a soft top.

LITTLETOWN SPIDER CORNBREAD

- 1 1/2 cups cornmeal
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup sour milk
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 2 cups sweet milk
- 1 1/2 tablespoons fat
- 2 eggs

Austrian Style Beef Good

Pot roast is every country's favorite. Here's one recipe for preparing this inexpensive beef cut.

POT ROAST AUSTRIAN STYLE

Insert slivers of garlic into pot roast with rosemary leaves. Smear with allspice. 1/2 teaspoon mixed with olive oil to a 4 pound roast. Put in a Dutch oven with fat and brown meat. Remove and put in 2 chopped onions, 1 clove garlic and cook until clear. Add 1 tablespoon chopped parsley, 1/2 cup tomato sauce and add meat. Season with salt and pepper and 1 cup boiling water. Cover tightly and simmer slowly for 2 1/2 hours. Add water as needed. Half hour before ready to serve, boil spaghetti and arrange in a serving dish with parmesan cheese and the gravy. Cinnamon may be added.
