



## Biscuits Take On Fancy Shapes

When it's Be-Kind-to-the-Pock-et-book week, let the biscuit dough turn the meat dish into a gala concection. Leftover meat, ground round steak or other inexpensive meat, simmering in its own gravy with vegetables, and topped with crescent shaped bis-

cuits, makes exciting table talk.

Brown the meat in fat first them combine the heated, cooked vegetables and season well. Put in casserole and top with biscuit dough cut in fancy shapes. If the meat is uncooked, simmer covered for an hour before biscuits are added. Cook at 425 degrees after biscuits are put on top.

Contrast in color and texture

Nobody should know better how to make chocolate frosting, than the makers of chocolate. Here's an official recipe from one of them.

CHOCOLATE BOILED FROSTING 2 % cups sugar 1 teaspoon light corn syrup 1 cup boiling water
