

Albany Slates Spring Fete

Windows on Display During Entire Day; Program Broadcast

ALBANY—Oregon Journal Juniors will be one of the highlights of the spring opening here today. The Juniors, numbering around 30, will present two vaudeville shows Thursday night. A special stage will be erected at the intersection of First and Broadalbin streets upon which the shows will be presented.

A change has been made in the opening program this year, inasmuch that there will be no formal unveiling of store windows Thursday night. Merchants will have windows decorated by Thursday morning and they will be open to inspection all day. However there will be prizes as usual for the best decorated windows, with judges being selected outside Albany.

The first vaudeville show will start at 7:30 and the second around 9 o'clock. Juniors will be supported by Regina Curlee's drum majorettes. There will also be street parades by which the Albany high school band and drum corps will take part. KWIL will broadcast the downtown program by remote control from the stage at First and Broadalbin.

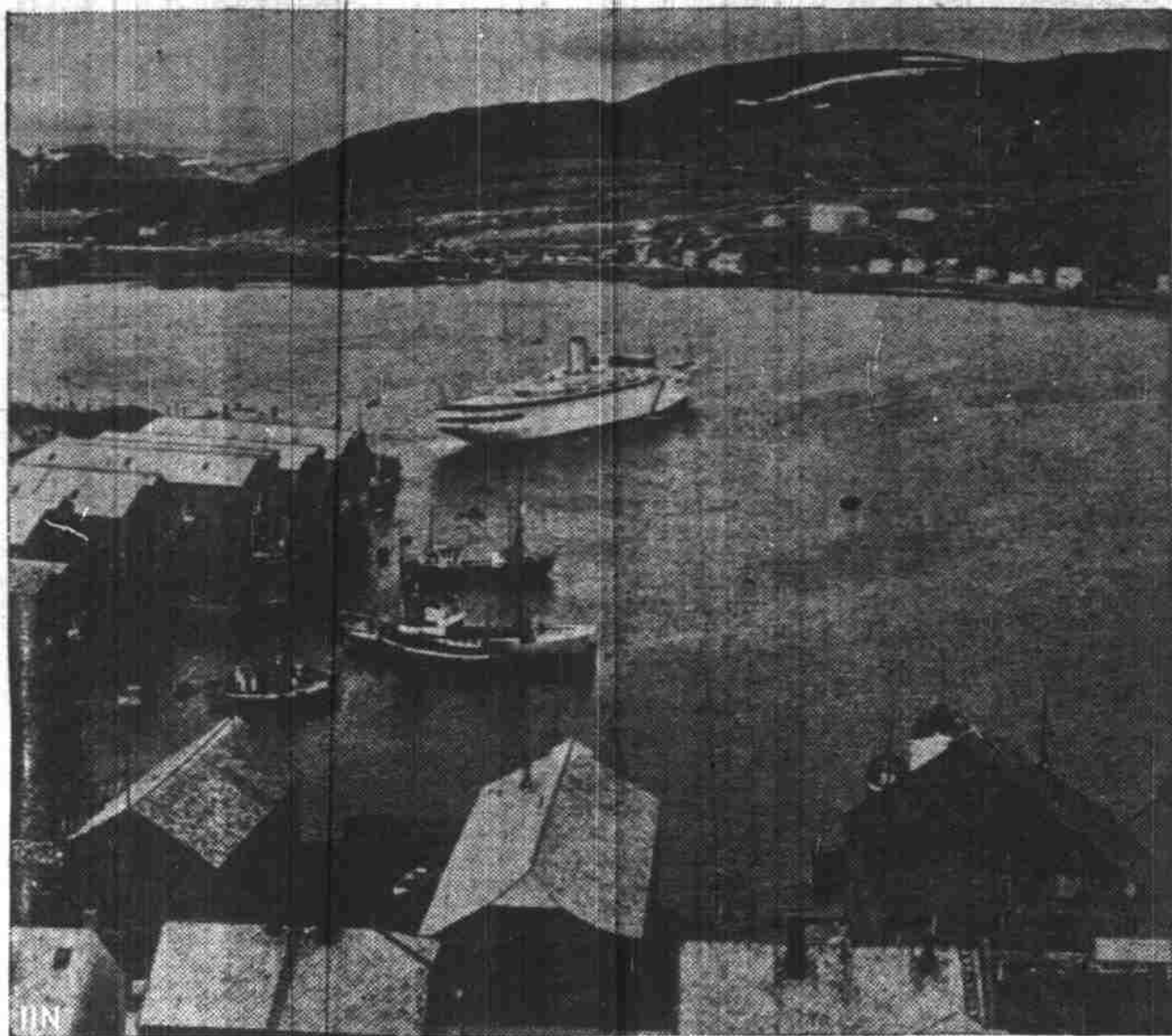
Ohio Man Dies At Albany

British Made Daring Raid Against Nazis Here

According to an announcement from London, the British destroyed 11 German ships, a munitions plant and captured 225 military prisoners in a daring raid on the Nazi-held Norwegian Lofoten

Islands, which lie off the coast of Norway above the Arctic Circle. It was Britain's first combined naval and land attack on German-occupied territory since the war began.

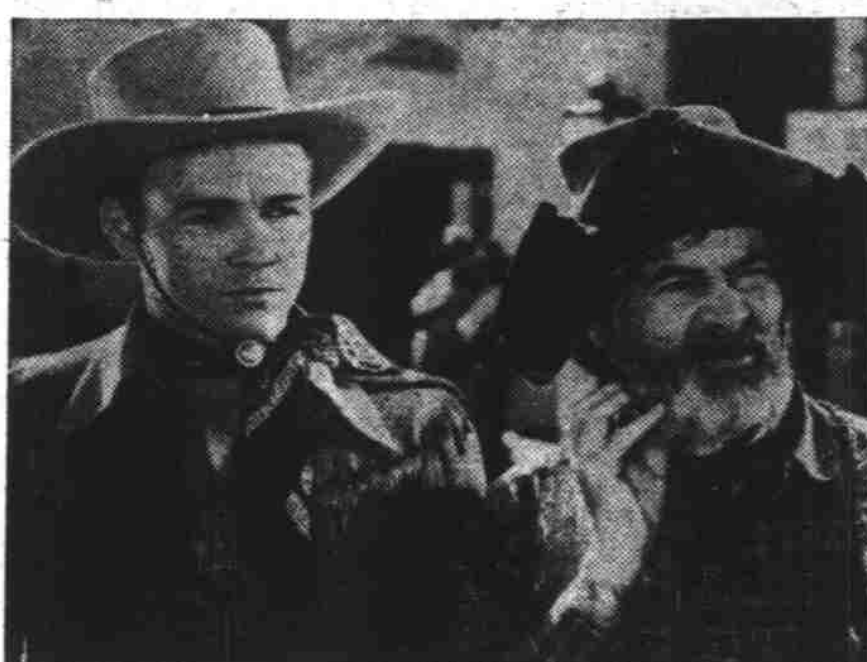

US Senator Holman Commended For Stand by Mt. Angel Club

Article Reviewed Concerning Danger of Increased Centralized Power

MT. ANGEL—The Mt. Angel Civic club, meeting at the Alfred Huber home Tuesday night, delved deeper into world issues, and commended Senator Rufus Holman, for his courageous stand on opposing the lease-lend bill and emphatically disapproved of Senator McNary's position. The secretary was instructed to write letters to the two senators, voicing the club's opinion.

Holman's speech, as given in the Oregon Statesman of March 5, in which he denounced the bill as a "proposal to undermine the constitution" and named Britain as the "ace aggressor of all time" was read by the president. Since the bill is now a law further comment was deemed useless.

A short discussion on the Jones Wine bill and seeming futility of getting aid for Oregon berry growers was held.

A lengthy article from the Brooklyn Tablet was read, explaining in detail the financial system which enabled Germany to rise from a conquered nation into a conqueror in the short space of eight years and told how the United States is resorting to the same means to gain the same purpose.

Through an intricate system the German government directly controls earnings, savings and investments of its citizens and thus indirectly controls the costs of production, prices and rate of consumption.

The United States is using these instruments with moderation, the writer explains, but as the war progresses will sacrifice moderation to cope with confiscation, regimentation, and socialization practiced by the totalitarian nations.

The remainder of the meeting was taken up with the discussion of the article and signs of the writer's plausibility were seen in government bonds to control savings and the effort to control wages. It was also noted that hints of things planned can be seen from time to time in Mrs. Roosevelt's daily newspaper column "My Day."

The next meeting of the club will be Tuesday, April 25, at the home of John Von Weiss.
