She quoted Gandhi as saying that Christians didn't realize their advantage with the Bible printed in a language they can read. During their vacation, Indian students spend their time teaching adults to read.

Replaces Old Unit on Same Street; Present Staff Retained With Roy Klum in Charge; Downtown Move Planned by Howard

Salem Selected For NYA Unit

As part of Oregon's NYA preparations for national defense, Salem has been selected as one of the strategic points in the state to locate an emergency power supply unit for NYA radio transmitters constructed by youth workers, by the defense communications board, Washington, DC, according to Ivan G. Munro, state administrator.

This project will make it possible for reserve power supplies to be available in Oregon in the event of any national defense emergency when normal sources of electric power are stopped. While commercial electric companies in the state are said to have very adequate facilities to cover such an emergency, these NYA power supplies would serve as auxiliary units should the need arise, and would be able to operate independently of any outside aid.

These emergency power supply units in the form of gas-driven electric generators, will also be located in Bend, Klamath Falls and Portland, after main radio transmitters for the NYA radio project in these cities are on the air.

Pendleton Air Base Has 75 Buildings

PENDLETON, March 20-(AP)—The US army air base here had 75 buildings under construction Thursday with approximately 300 men at work. Officers said the peak of employment would be reached about April 1.

Four supply houses and two administration buildings are nearly completed, with one of the latter to be occupied immediately by Col. Frank W. Wright and his staff.

McMINNVILLE, March 20-(AP)—Officials said Thursday that construction work on state highway No. 18 between McMinnville and Sheridan had started. A bridge crew is putting a span over Deer creek.

Nazi Peace Offer Seen

PORTLAND, March 20-(AP)—Arnold Lunn, British author, predicted Thursday that Germany would sue for peace next year before her army meets defeat.

He told interviewers he based his opinion on remarks made by "three men who know more about Europe than any other three men you could name."

They told him, Lunn said, "The war will end on account of a palace revolution. It will come from the top, not the bottom. The German generals are not going to make the mistake of the last war, they are not going to wait until they are defeated to ask for an armistice. They are coming to the peace convention with an undefeated army, but with Hitler kicked out of the picture."

Australians Cheer Yanks

SYDNEY, Australia, March 20-(AP)—Bombed by showers of confetti and paper streamers and cheered by thousands of holidaying Australians, American blue-jackets from seven US warships paraded through Sydney's streets Thursday in a demonstration of goodwill.

Later at an official luncheon at city hall for officers of the squadron 400 guests heard Rear Admiral John H. Newton of the US fleet declare, "We would rather die as free men than live as slaves."

"We like the Australians," he said. "We liked them in the last war when they were fighting with us for the same democracy they are fighting for now. You think the way Americans do. You act like Americans. What is more, you fight like Americans." "We are proud to be of the

same race as you," he added. "The lease-lend bill is setting in motion the legal machinery which will result in America assisting to win the war."

Heart Attack Proves Fatal

B. D. Young, 46, an employe of the Oregon Pulp & Paper company, apparently died as the result of a heart attack at the mill Thursday afternoon, First Aid Captain Percy L. Clark said.

First aid men were called, but Young had succumbed on their arrival. He was later officially pronounced dead at the Salem Deaconess hospital.

Young suffered a head injury in a fall, but it was believed the fall followed the heart attack.

The body was turned over to County Coroner L. E. Barrick, but no inquest is expected.
