

House Votes Control of Coal Prices

WASHINGTON, March 27—(P)—Refusing to consider any amendments and acting virtually without opposition, the house voted Thursday an additional two years of federal regulation of minimum prices for all soft coal.

Meantime, the senate approved a bill, endorsed by the United Mine Workers of America, for annual federal inspection of all coal mines. An amendment eliminating educational requirements for inspectors will send the bill back to the house for action.

A voice vote in the house sending the price regulation bill to the senate followed arguments for the measure by a score or more members from most coal states and many consuming centers.

Almost without exception they endorsed entirely the extension bill drawn by Representative Bolland (D-Pa.) and approved by the ways and means committee.

Just one month's time remains for the senate to act on the bill before the Guffey coal act, passed in 1937, would automatically expire on April 28.

Army Bombers Land Enroute To Alaska

PRINCE GEORGE, B.C., March 27—(CP)—A squadron of eight United States army Douglas B-18 bombing planes landed here Thursday en route from McChord field, Wash., to Anchorage, Alaska, and caused a flurry of excitement in this northerly interior town and hastily-formed plans to entertain the squadron's personnel of 40 airmen.

The squadron, under command of Captain Donahue will be refueled here and will resume its flight to Anchorage Friday morning.

Shortly after the bombers roared down to Prince George field, the Yukon Southern Air transport's regular plane, Yukon Prince, landed with passengers and mail from the Yukon, en route to Vancouver. Its arrival brought to nine the number of planes on the Prince George field, the largest number ever to land on the field at one time.

Oregon Pulp Pays Bond Dividend

Directors of the Oregon Pulp and Paper company, meeting here Thursday, authorized a 10 per cent dividend on outstanding earnings bonds of the company for the biennial period ending in June.

The dividend represents a return of five per cent for each of the two years on the par value of the bonds.

Basking Shark Drifts Ashore At Tillamook

TILLAMOOK, March 27—(P)—A huge sea animal which drifted ashore at Hobsonville on Tillamook bay was identified by fish experts Thursday as a basking shark, extremely rare in these waters.

The Jones Fish company, Garibaldi, reported that it was crippled so badly, probably from being hit by a log raft, that it died soon after coming ashore. The company sold its liver, weighing many pounds and rich in oil, salts and vitamins, to an Astoria processing firm.

The carcass, 35 feet long, was estimated to weigh two to three tons.

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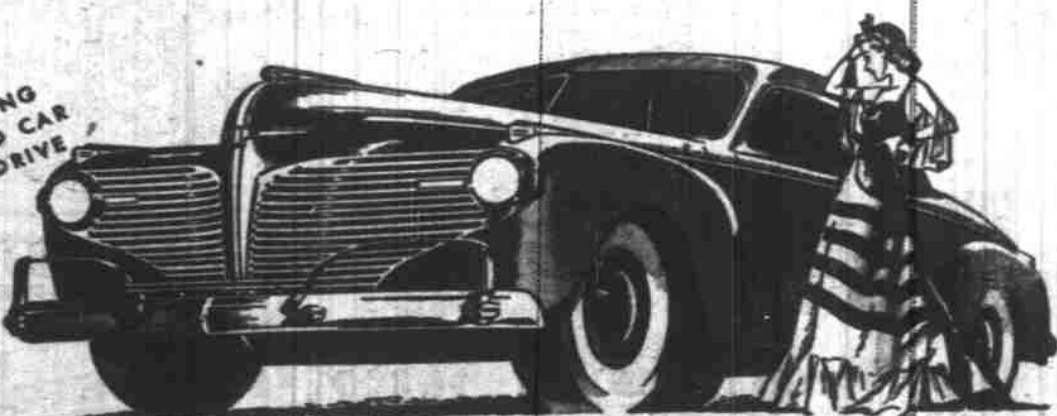

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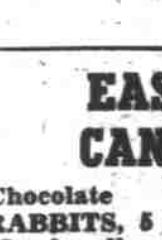
