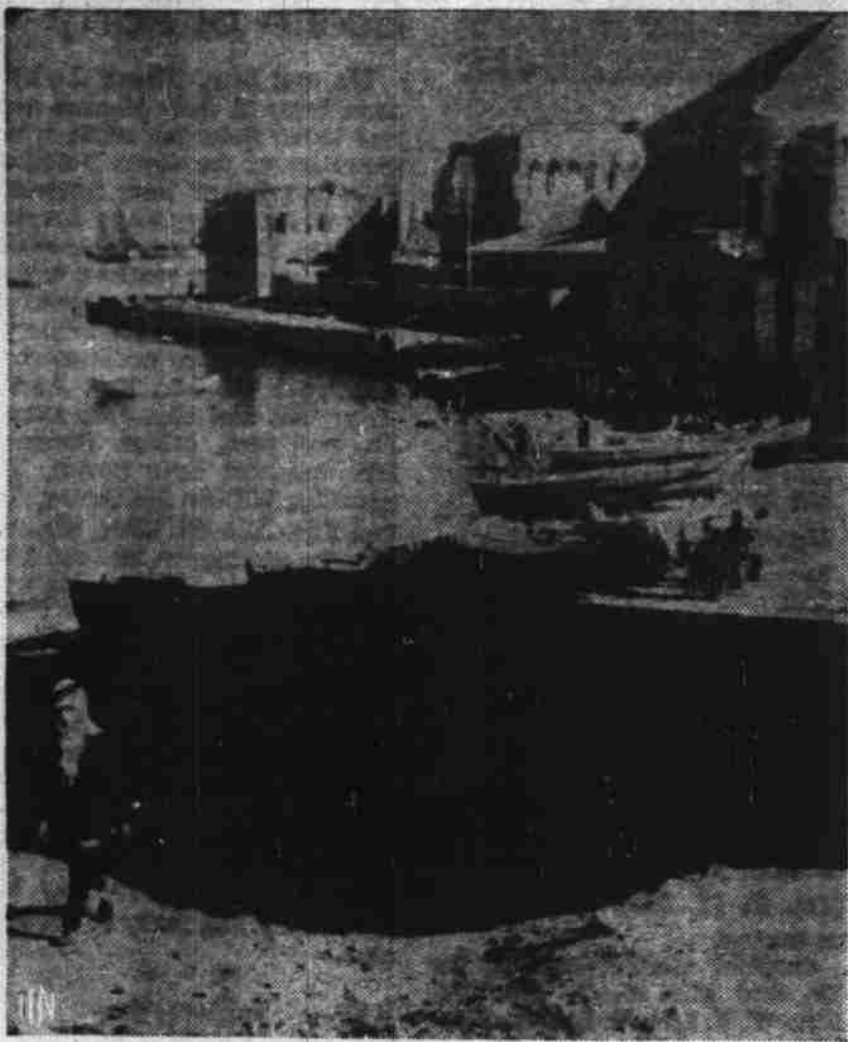


### Under Nazi Control, Is Report
