Former Marion Resident Dies

ALBANY—James McDonald, 83, former resident of Marion county, died at his home in Shedd Wednesday morning. Funeral services will be held from the Fisher Funeral home, Albany, Friday at 1:30 p. m. with Rev. A. T. Finkbeiner in charge. Burial will be in the Harmony cemetery at Sheridan.

Born in Poynette, Wis., August 12, 1857, McDonald spent his early years in that state. In 1890 he married Alice Cartwright and that same year they came to Oregon, locating on a farm in Marion county where they lived for a number of years. From there they moved to Polk county and then to Lane, before coming to Linn county 30 years ago, since which

time the deceased had lived in the vicinity of Shedd. Mrs. McDonald died in 1903.

Surviving are two sons, Hubert R. and Herbert W., both of Shedd; two daughters, Mrs. Maud Dalrymple of Tillamook and Miss Valera McDonald of Shedd, and three grandchildren.
