Murphy Retires as Board Chairman; Others Elected

STAYTON — Lawrence Smith was elected a member on the school board to succeed Grant Murphy, retiring chairman. Edw. J. Bell was reelected clerk.

Murphy had served 21 years and a rising vote of thanks was extended him for his services.

The budget of \$14,197 was accepted. An extra tax of \$3000 to take care of the expense of operating a school bus. Since this district has ceased to furnish a transportation system it has lost students, and it is felt that the tuition money gained from these students will offset the extra \$3000 tax over a period of three years.
