

Lingua Laces Ball to Take WT's Batting Leadership; Helser Paces Loop Hurlers

Speedy Al Lingua, outfielder-catcher of the Vancouver Capilanos, laced out 11 hits in 20 trips last week to move into batting leadership of the Western International league with a .374 average, according to official statistics released Saturday by the Howe News-Bureau of Chicago.

Lingua moved 14 points in front of Yakima's Roy Younker, who kept a steady pace to retain second place at .360. Chief Levi McCormack stood his ground in third, while Tacoma's Elmer Mallory batted his way from ninth to fifth by virtue of a 25-point increase from .317 to .345.

Lingua is still the leader in hits with 73 and in two-base hits with 23. Pete Hughes of Spokane knocked five balls out of the parks and continues to be the home run king with 16. He also leads in runs batted in with 52, one more than Smead Jolley of Vancouver.

Roy Helser of Salem ran his pitching leadership to nine straight wins without a loss by adding one victory during the week. Helser's nine-game record includes 74 innings pitched, 65 hits allowed, 22 runs scored, 41 bases on balls, 53 strikeouts, one hit batter and two wild pitches.
