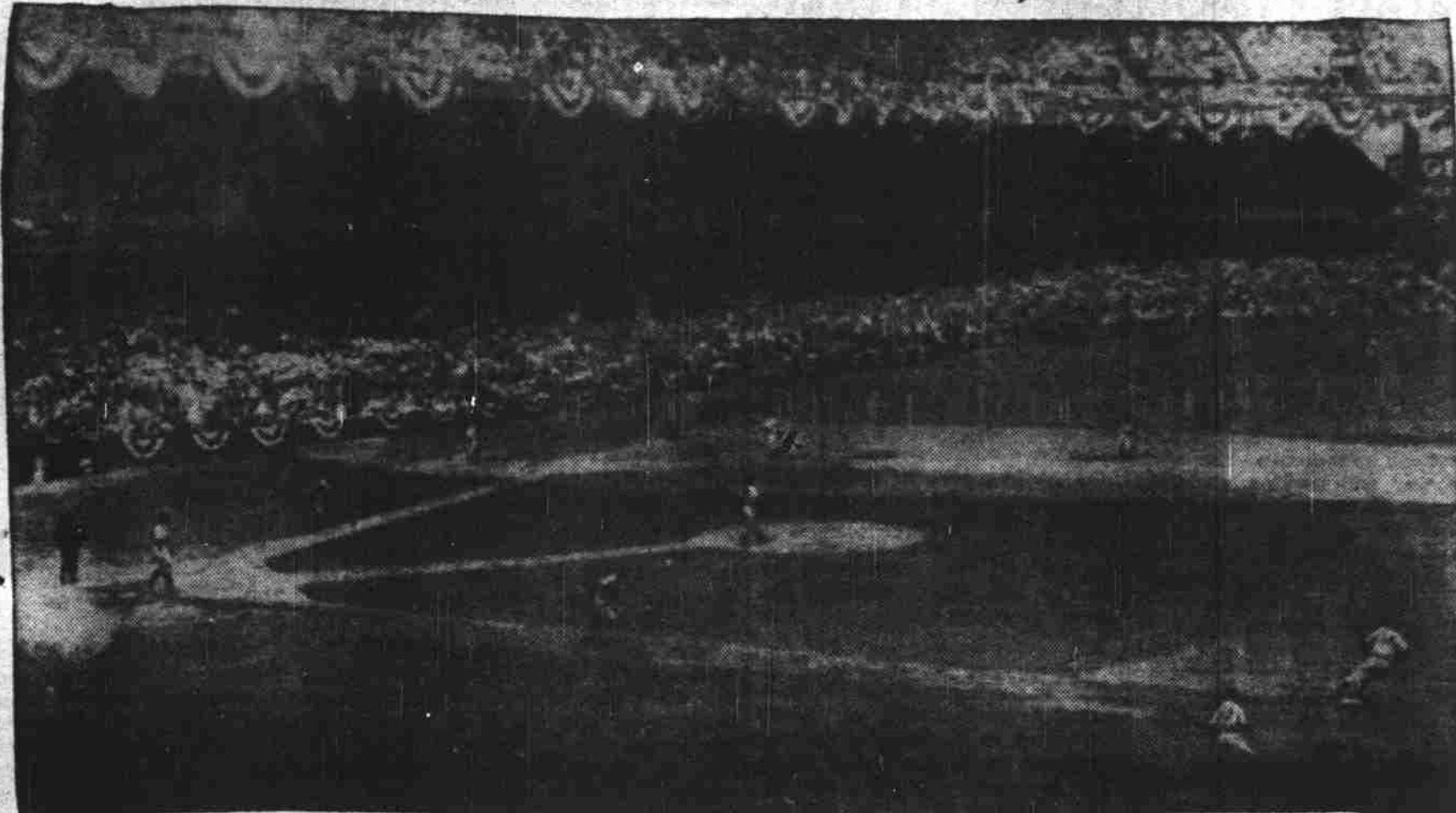
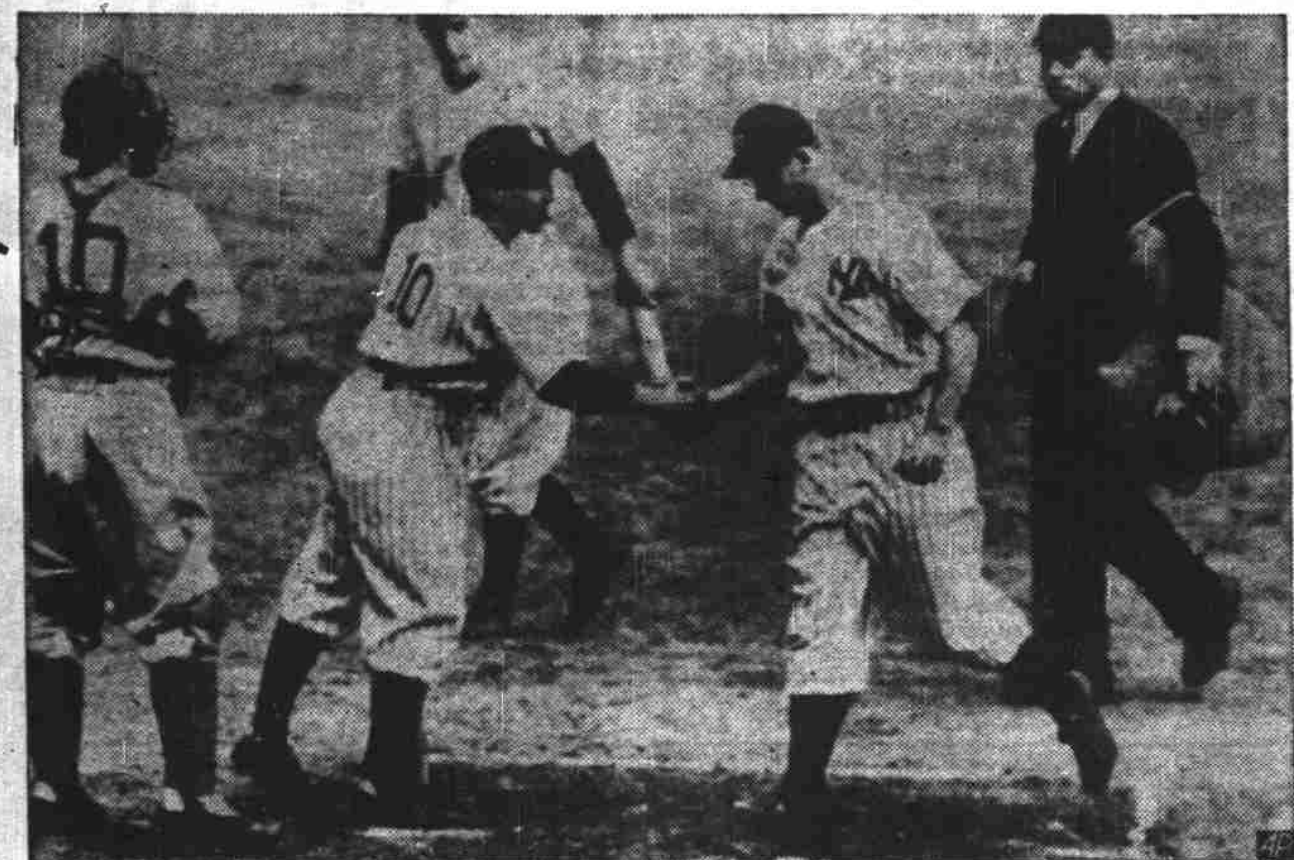


That Record World Series Crowd — 68,540 of 'Em

NOGALES, Sonora, Mex.—(AP)—Dams are being built on the west coast of Mexico to insure a plentiful supply of winter vegetables for the United States in years to come. Thousands of carloads of tomatoes, peas, lettuce and other vegetables are cleared through this border city every season, and the output will be vastly expanded when new lands are placed in production. Angling Good For Weekend

PORTLAND, Oct. 2.—(AP)—Coastal streams will provide generally good fishing this weekend, the state game department's weekly bulletin said Thursday.

Salmon runs are fairly common in coastal streams and trout and jack salmon are comparatively abundant. Best streams are the Necanicum, Klaskanine and Lewis and Clark rivers. The bulletin by counties includes: Lane—Good catches of trout being made in both North and South Santiam river.

Benton—Salmon fishing good in lower Alsea river. Lane—McKenzie river good for trout. Willamette fair. Shallow very good for trout and fair for salmon near Florence, Lakes fair. Douglas—Umpqua river fair for salmon trout, trout and an occasional summer steelhead. Some silvers striking in Schofield river.

Josephine—Conditions ideal and angling generally good. Clatsop—All coastal streams good, including Necanicum, Klaskanine and Lewis and Clark rivers. Catches include jacksalmon, searun trout and an occasional silver as well as trout. Tillamook—Trout fishing and salmon trolling fair. Jack salmon angling off.

Cook—Lower Coquille river good for silver salmon. Curry—Salmon fishing very good in Rogue river, steelhead and cutthroat plentiful in Pistol river and throughout angling good in Chetco river.
