### Watson Will **Accept Court** Tax Ruling

Attorneys for Tom Watson. Multnomah county assessor, will not file an answer in event the state supreme court overrules their demurrer to a mandamus proceeding to compel Watson to comply with a recent order of the state tax commission directing a method for levying the 1941 property assessments, Arthur Benson, court clerk, announced here Wednesday.

John Logan, attorney for Wat-son, announced during the mandamus arguments Tuesday, that in case the demurrer was overruled he would file an answer. He later decided not to file an answer and so informed the court, Benson said.

Attorneys for the state tax commission announced that they would stand on the supreme court decision on the demurrer.


