Sweets Are Good in Winter

Now that there's a decided tang to the air, even when the sun is shining, desserts take on a new meaning.

Something sweet and rich, no matter how fattening, tastes mighty good and even the most strong minded of women may feel the urge to break down and cook something like:

APPLE DUMPLINGS 2 cups sifted flour 4 teaspoons baking powder 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/2 cup shortening 1/2 cup milk 6 medium size apples, peeled 3 tablespoons sugar 3 teaspoons cinnamon Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Work in shortening with fingertips until consistency of coarse corn meal. Add milk to make soft dough. Place on floured board and knead lightly for a few seconds. Roll to thickness of about 1/4 inch and cut into 6-inch squares to cover the apples. Core apples and place one on each square. Fill each core cavity with 1 tablespoon sugar and 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon. Moisten edges of dough and fold-up around apple so corners will meet on top. Press edges lightly together. Place in a baking dish with the following syrup:

3 cups water 1 1/2 cups sugar 1/4 cup molasses 1/4 cup butter Cook until sugar is dissolved. Bake dumplings in moderately hot oven (370 degrees F.) about 20 minutes. Then reduce temperature to slow 300 degrees and bake 30 minutes, or until apples are tender. Baste occasionally with the syrup. Serve warm with cream. Serves 6.
