County Herd Given Honors

Miller Estate Jerseys Placed in Class 'Good Plus'

"Constructive Breeders Registry" honors go to two more Oregon Jersey establishments for the commendable breeding accomplishments over a period of years. The herds owned by Mrs. Florence E. Gale Neal, Oregon City, and the estate of Sidney Miller, Woodburn, are the most recent winners of the meritorious award made by the American Jersey Cattle club. The national organization reports that in both instances there has been a 30-year

program of pure Jersey breeding. Mrs. Neal's herd has been on production test for five years through the herd improvement registry system of the club. The last test was made with an entry of 21 cows, one-third of which were first-calf heifers, averaging 418.58 pounds of butterfat, 7091 pounds of milk per cow.

The present herd has been classified with an average score of "good plus." The one-time world champion Jersey producer. Tiddledywink's Quality Girl, has brought much recognition to the Neal herd.

Herd testing in the Miller herd has likewise been carried on for five years, though the fifth record is not yet completed. The four- Ala year average per cow is 504.30 Al pounds of butterfat, 8151 pounds of milk on twice-daily milking.

The last test record was made Am with an entry of 40 cows and an Am average of 20 cows in milk daily. Am About one-half of these were Am first-calf heifers and the record Am was 519.67 pounds of butterfat, Am 8455 pounds of milk per cow. Nine Am had "star" ratings for their exceptional yields, the highest being 731.76 pounds butterfat, 12,-089 pounds milk in 309 days. This Ben record was made by the mature Bet cow. Silver Lad's Frances.

The present herd of 27 cows. all bred in the herd, has been elassified with a "good plus" average. Two cows had ratings of "excellent."

Both herds have been federal Cel accredited free from tuberculosis Che for a period of 20 years and are Chi free from Bang's disease.

Neal W. Miller is engaged_in the direction of work with the Cor long-established herd founded by the late Sidney Miller.






