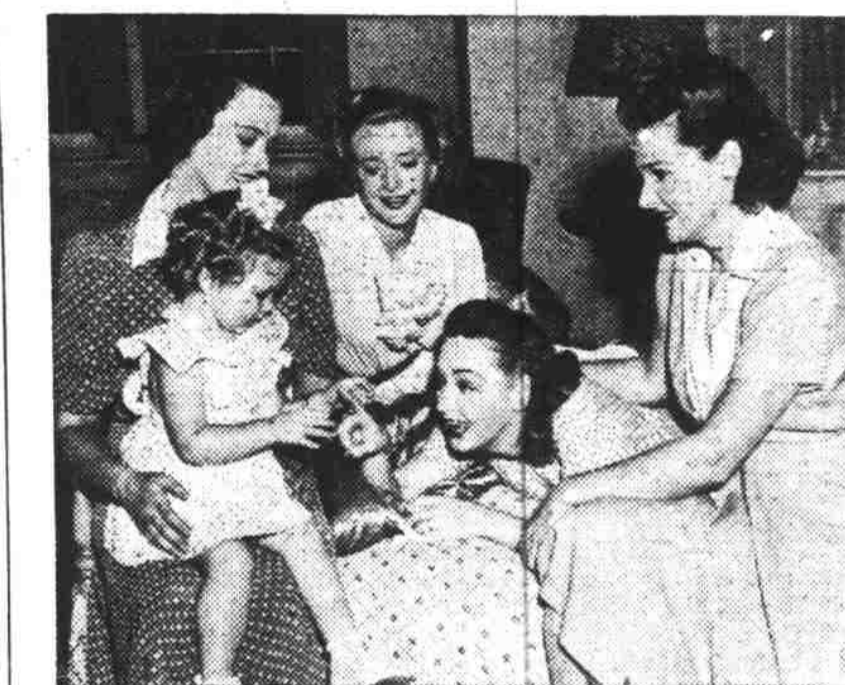

New Singer At Elsinore

Rise Stevens, Nelson Eddy Starred in 'Chocolate Soldier'

"The Chocolate Soldier," new musical comedy, which opened at the Elsinore theatre yesterday, offers Nelson Eddy in a gay, romantic role, and introduces Rise Stevens, a new singing star.

Not only does the picture give Eddy's voice full range with a wide variety of songs, but it gives him a part ideally suited to him, as a young singer and husband determined to find out whether or not his wife loves him and him alone. Their harum-scarum domestic life reaches its climax when he masquerades as his own rival.

For the first time on the screen, Eddy sings in two voices, his natural baritone and bass, in playing the dual roles.

A notable addition to this musical extravaganza is the glamorous personality and brilliant voice of Rise Stevens. The first American girl to portray the fiery Delilah in "Samson and Delilah" for the Metropolitan opera in 22 years, she sings one of the arias in the picture and proves herself a definite screen "find."

The dance productions, created by Ernst and Maria Matray, are another high point, especially the hilarious "Seek the Spy" ballet. Scored by Herbert Stothart, "The Chocolate Soldier" offers a great variety of song numbers. Miss Stevens' rendition of "The Trout" and Eddy's singing of "The Song of the Flea," which he sings in Russian, are highlights, and their duets of the Oscar Straus numbers, particularly "My Hero," are worth the price of admission alone.

The supporting cast of "The Chocolate Soldier" includes Nigel Bruce, Florence Bates, Charles Judels, Nydia Westman, Dorothy Gilmore and a host of ballet and eccentric dancers.

Entire Film 'Just Murder'

Something unique in the way of murder thrillers, "Among the Living," with Albert Dekker in a dual role, is playing today at the Capitol theatre.
