Many vacations of course have been cut short, but even a day's holiday will see sons and daughters on the road, bound for home.

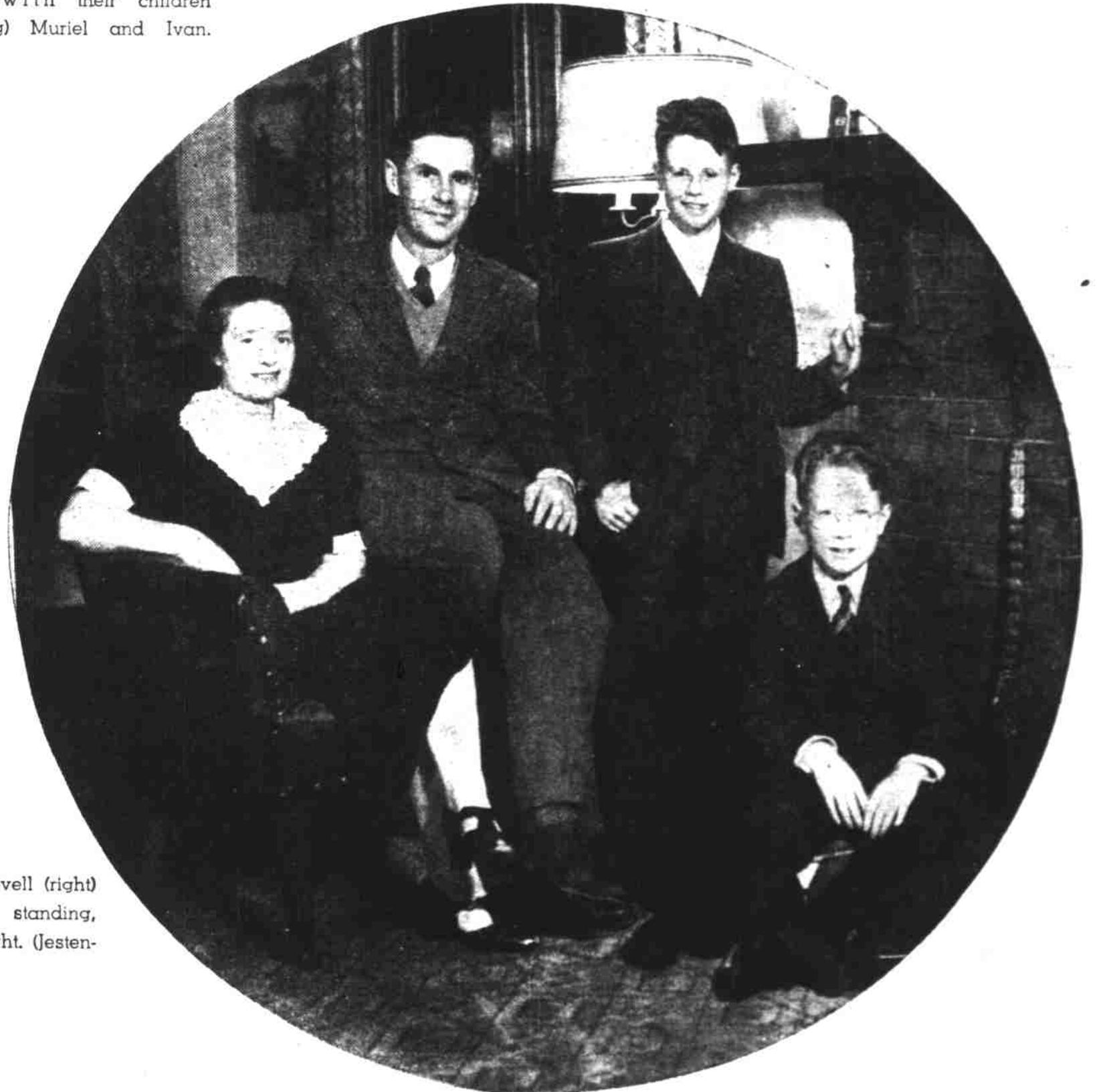
Many army wives plan to be with soldier husbands for Christmas day if possible.
