War Relief Work Done

Red Cross First Aid, Sewing Units Formed In Valley Towns

DALLAS—Mrs. C. L. Crider, war relief production chairman, gave a report on the Polk county Red Cross chapter, covering the work accomplished in the county since September 1.

A total of 1857 garments have been made by volunteer workers in the various communities of the county. The last of these garments were shipped this week to New Jersey for transportation overseas.

The Red Cross room will close Tuesday until after the holidays, unless there is an emergency call.

A meeting has been called for Monday at the high school auditorium at 8 p. m. to organize a class in Red Cross first aid training.

Dr. E. B. Bossatti, first aid chairman, Dr. Wayne J. Page, chairman of the medical group and Ed Gilmore, chairman of instructors will be in charge.

Garments completed here are as follows: women's dresses, 4; girls dresses, 29; boys shirts 13; overalls, 2 pair; women's shawls, 11; bed jackets, 11; operating gowns seven; convalescing gowns, seven; girl's skirts, 10; sox, 9 pair; stockings, one pair; men's sweaters, four; women's sweaters, four; children's sweaters, four; mittens, six pair; small quilts, 10.

A new allotment will arrive in January and all women are asked to assist in this work.
