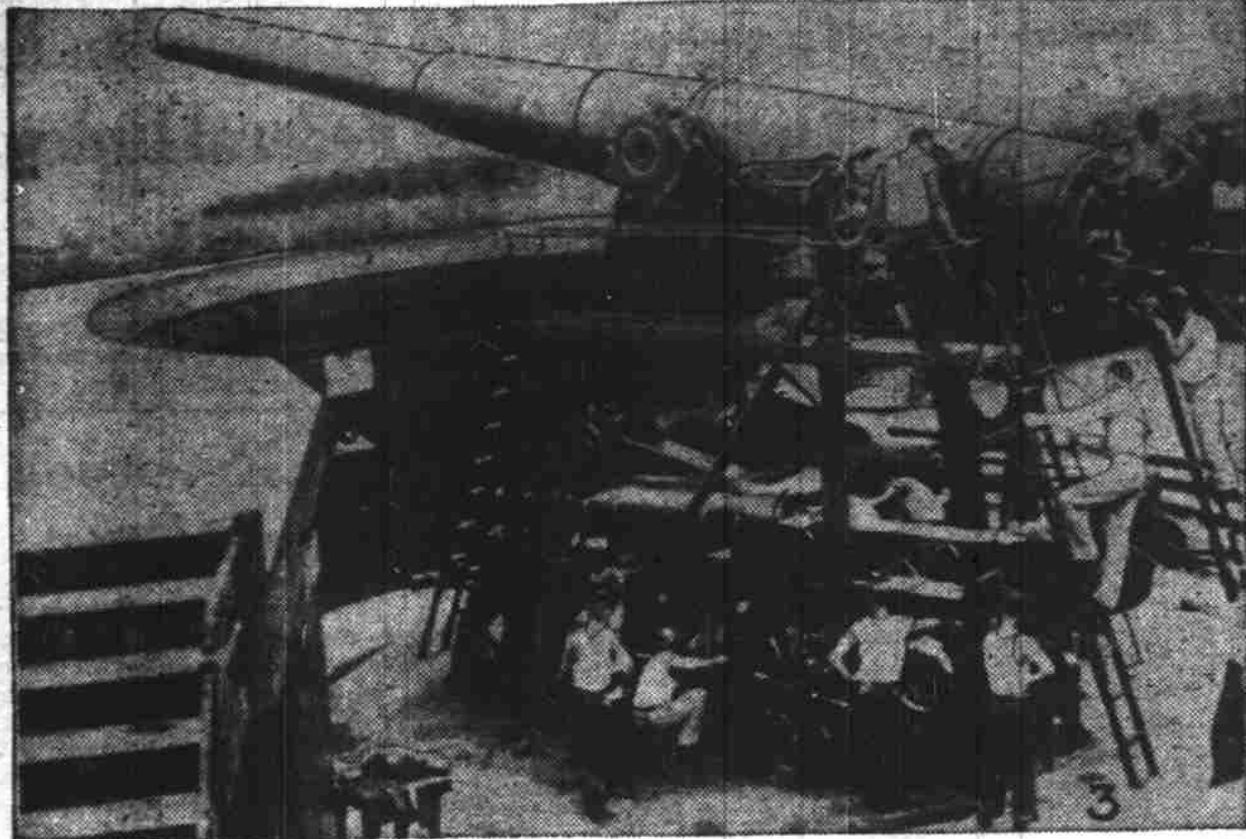
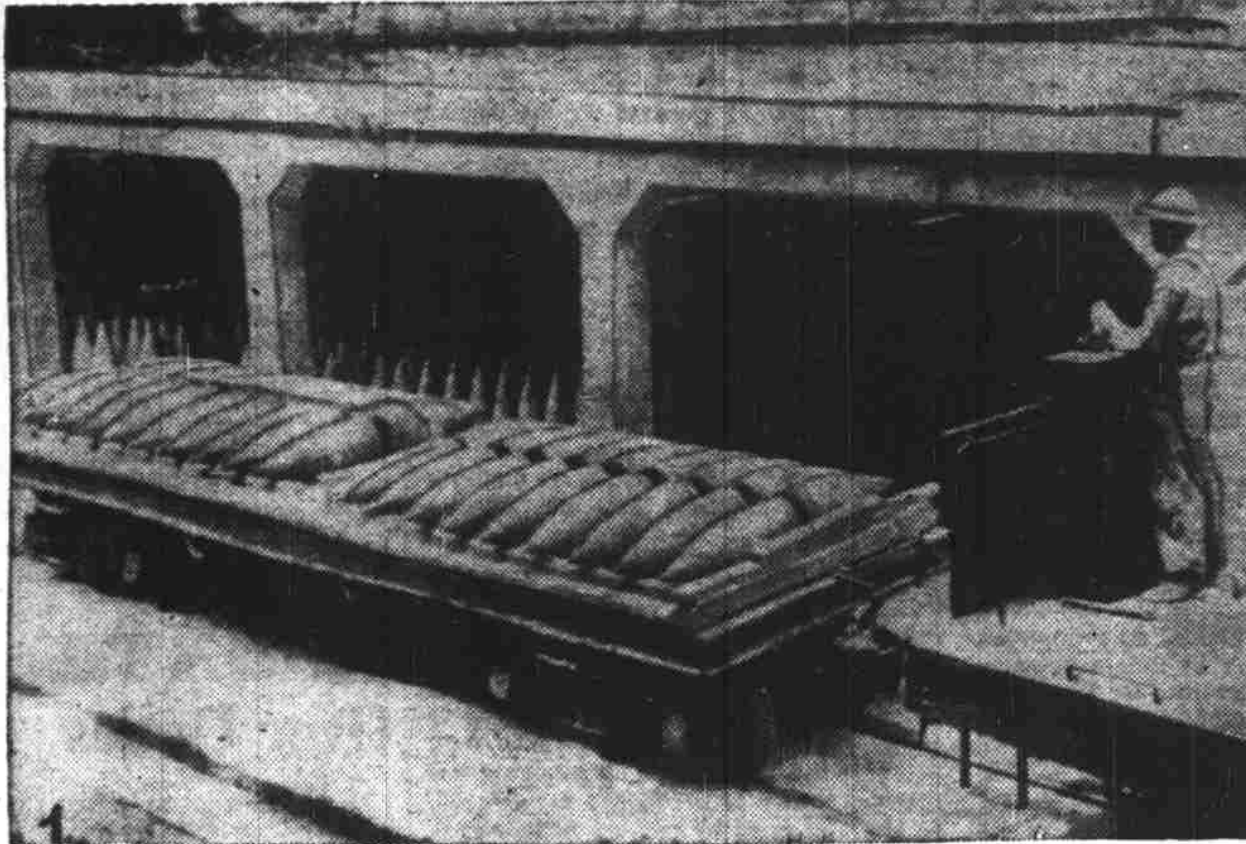


Some More Pictures of Strong Corregidor Defenses

Mine Stockholders Consider Property Sale on Santiam

SCIO—Written vote of Crown Mine stockholders on proposal to sell the property on the Little North Fork of the Santiam in eastern Marion county on option and royalty basis will be made at a meeting January 20 at Scio Odd Fellows hall.

Voice vote of the stockholders at a special meeting some weeks ago was largely in favor of the sale. The property is valued at \$200,000.

Addition to the east end of St. Bernard's Catholic church in Scio has been completed, labor being donated by members.

Service Men To Get Books

Collection Campaign Being Organized In Mt. Angel

MT. ANGEL—Mt. Angel will add its part to the national campaign to gather 10,000,000 books for the use of soldiers, sailors and marines. The campaign starts January 12.

Anyone wishing to share their books with the boys in service should leave them at the Mt. Angel public library. Theresa Dehler, librarian, will take charge of the local campaign.

Local organizations behind the work are St. Mary's parish, Knights of Columbus, Catholic Daughters of America, Red Cross, American Legion and American Legion auxiliary.

The government supplies libraries to the larger camps, but the smaller units have no library at all and everywhere the demand exceeds the supply.

All kinds of books are wanted. The national library association, which organized the campaign, says the boys are especially eager for up-to-date technical material to help with their problems, as well as books on current affairs, and plenty of good fiction.

The books will be sent to the USO houses, army dayrooms, ships and naval bases.

Donors are asked to write their names and address in the books they give, as it will add to the interest of the boys to know who gave the book.

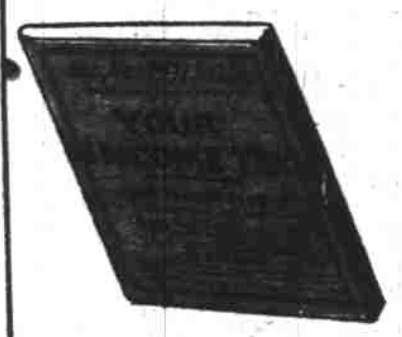
