

Stock Market Recovery Seen

Specialties, Steels, Rails Advance After Hesitant Beginning

NEW YORK, Jan. 12.—(AP)—For the first time in a week, the stock market, on a average, Monday leaned toward the recovery side.

Buyers came in for steels, rails and assorted specialties after a hesitant start and, at the top, gains ran to a point or so for favorites, with a few "blue chips" in front 2 to 3. Peak prices were reduced in the majority of cases at the close.

The Associated Press composite of 60 stocks was up 2.2 of a point at 37.8, first advance in this barometer since last Monday. The principal fly in the bullish ointment was the lack of volume on the right-about. Transfers totaled 491,540 shares compared with 654,490 Friday and were the smallest since October 27.

Prominent stocks on the forward tilt included US Steel, Bethlehem, Youngstown Sheet, Union Pacific, Great Northern, American Telephone, Coca-Cola, Douglas Aircraft, Anaconda, General Electric, US Rubber and Montgomery Ward.

Allied Chemical dropped 4 on a negligible turnover. Lesser declines were posted for United Aircraft, Sperry, Eastman Kodak, Standard Oil (NJ), Goodrich and Caterpillar Tractor. Motors, copers, oils, utilities and aircraft were for the most part narrow. Tax doubts remained as a detriment to a number of stocks.

Fertilizer Use Urged to Grow Better Crops

Use of fertilizer to increase the yield and quality of crops may aid in meeting war food needs this next season and at the same time add to the profit of Oregon farmers, says Dr. W. L. Powers, head of the soils department at Oregon State college, in reporting on the results of field fertilizer trials this past season.

More details on these results, as well as other features in handling Oregon farm soils to best advantage, will be discussed fully at the annual soils short course to be held at the college January 29 to 31.

Use of fertilizer this past season on many of the crops of which increased production is sought has shown that fertilization will show far toward insuring the greater production needed, even without increasing the acreage, said Dr. Powers.

For example, an 8.3 per cent increase in corn is sought in Oregon. Use of lime, manure and superphosphate increased the yield of corn silage more than 50 per cent on a Willamette silt loam field. Use of nitrogen, potash, and phosphate with fiber flax increased the yield from 1.98 tons per acre to 2.45 tons.

An increase of 48 per cent was obtained by fertilizing table beets, while high potash fertilizers boosted black raspberry, boysenberry, and Cuthbert raspberry yields materially.

In addition to experimenting with the standard fertilizer elements, extensive work is also being carried on at the college with the so-called minor elements.

Among these, boron has been given most extensive trials in the last few years. The use of boron, supplied as borax, has given increases of 1 1/2 to 2 tons of alfalfa per acre on soils of northwestern Oregon, which are deficient in this element.

Some 50,000 acres of alfalfa in northwestern Oregon will give profitable response from the application of 30 to 40 pounds of granular borax per acre sown like clover seed, says Dr. Powers.
