

# Trinity Church Makes Plans for Golden Anniversary Fete

SILVERTON—Fifty-year anniversary plans for Trinity were started Wednesday at the annual congregation meeting. Plans call for a celebration in June but the exact dates will not be set until early in February when tentative program arrangements will also get under way.

Appointed as a committee to make arrangements are M. G. Gunderson, L. H. Meyer, Silas Torvend, Amos Corhouse, with Althea Meyer and Lillie Madsen as assistants.

Further plans call for a financial drive for the celebration with an effort to raise \$50 for each of

the 50 years of the congregation. The \$2500 will be used to repair, reshingle and otherwise repair the church, to complete a sidewalk around the new parsonage, and repair the garage. Should any funds remain, this will be used on the parsonage fund.

Trinity church is completely out of debt with the exception of the new parsonage completed in early December. Funds to cover this has been pledged for a five-year period. However, members of the board explain, should the funds be received before the debt will be paid off.

Election of officers Wednesday night was held with Oscar Satern, Ed Anderson and Clifford Eklund elected to the board. Eklund will serve the unexpired term of W. C. Larson, who resigned because of his work which does not enable him to be in attendance at regular board meetings.

L. H. Meyer was made recording secretary, replacing Tom Anderson. Martin Hattberg and Ed Holden were elected financial secretaries; John Moe, treasurer; Henry Torvend, Sunday school superintendent, with Mrs. M. G. Gunderson as his assistant; Tom Anderson and Clifford Eklund, head ushers; Mrs. Alf O. Nelson and Peggy Goplerud, organists; M. C. Storstrue, cemetery board member. Holdover members on the board are M. G. Gunderson and C. J. Dahlen. Besides Larson, Amos Corhouse and Silas Torvend are retiring board members. C. Johnson was made janitor.

Fisher in Albany, and the following year they moved to Alberta, Can. In 1914 they returned to Albany and had made their home here since. She was a member of the United Presbyterian church.

ALBANY—Funeral services for Mrs. Lulu Howard, 68, member of an Oregon pioneer family and a resident of Albany for many years, were held from the Keeney Funeral home in Corvallis Friday afternoon. Burial was in Willamette Memorial park, Albany.

Mrs. Howard died in the Corvallis General hospital Wednesday afternoon following an illness of a week.

Born in Yamhill county on March 17, 1873, the deceased was a daughter of Harvey L. and Josephine Jones, Amity. She spent the early years of her life in Amity, graduating from the high school there. She later was graduated from Linfield college, McMinnville. On January 8, 1896, she was married to J. A. Howard, Amity. Following her marriage she made her home in Albany for a number of years.

In 1920 Mrs. Howard accepted a position at Oregon State college as housing and employment secretary for the YMCA, a position which she held until a year ago when she resigned because of failing health. Since 1934 she had been in complete charge of men's housing and employment at the college. She was a member of the Corvallis Methodist church.

Surviving are two sons, J. Francis, editor of Greater Oregon newspaper, Albany; and Fred, Portland; one daughter, Mrs. Paul West, Salem; one sister, Mrs. Bernard Christensen, Corvallis; and one brother, Herbert Jones, Grants Pass.
