

Stock Market Showing Poor

Smallest Turnover in Months Shown With Week Trade Down

NEW YORK, Feb. 14 (AP)—Stocks generally again overrode the war news in Saturday's market and selected issues emerged for an unsatisfactory week with further recovery leanings.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks Saturday was up .3 of a point. However, an .8 loss was shown for the week.

Transfers of 167,370 shares compared with 223,140 last Saturday and were the smallest since August 23 last. The week's aggregate of 1,946,310 was the lowest since early last July. Only 447 individual issues were traded, also a new low figure since August 23.

Stocks on the climbing side included Santa Fe, Chrysler, Westinghouse, Du Pont, Eastman Kodak, Johns-Manville, Allied Chemical, Great Northern, Pennsylvania, Southern Railway, General Motors, Phelps Dodge, Goodrich, Consolidated Aircraft, Western Union, Youngstown Sheet and Anaconda, Kennecott and Standard Oil (NJ).

US Steel was up 1/4 and Bethlehem unchanged, off a trifle were Texas Co., Sperry, J. C. Penney, Union Carbide and American Can.

Salem One of Top Cities in Buying

"Salem's effective buying income for the 12 months ending March 31 will be 24 per cent higher than for the like period of last year," forecasts Sales Management in a retail progress chart, analyzed here by C. S. McElhinny, local representative for the Oregon Mutual Life Insurance company.

"Salem is listed in the national tabulation as one of the high-spot cities, and its retail sales are mounting 2 per cent over the national rate of gain," McElhinny states further. "In the current year Salem's retail sales volume has upped \$5,000,000 over the 12 months previous. The year's figures represent a high-mark in retail sales."

Grain Market Gains Small

CHICAGO, Feb. 14 (AP)—Continuing to creep upward slowly, grain prices Saturday added fractions to the week's small net gains in a market strengthened more by lack of selling pressure than by any unusual interest.

Wheat closed 1/4 cent higher than Friday, May \$1.29 3/4-5/8, July \$1.31 1/4-1/8. Prices in most pits finished fractions to about a cent higher than a week ago, with wheat and corn about 4 cents below the four-year highs established late in January.

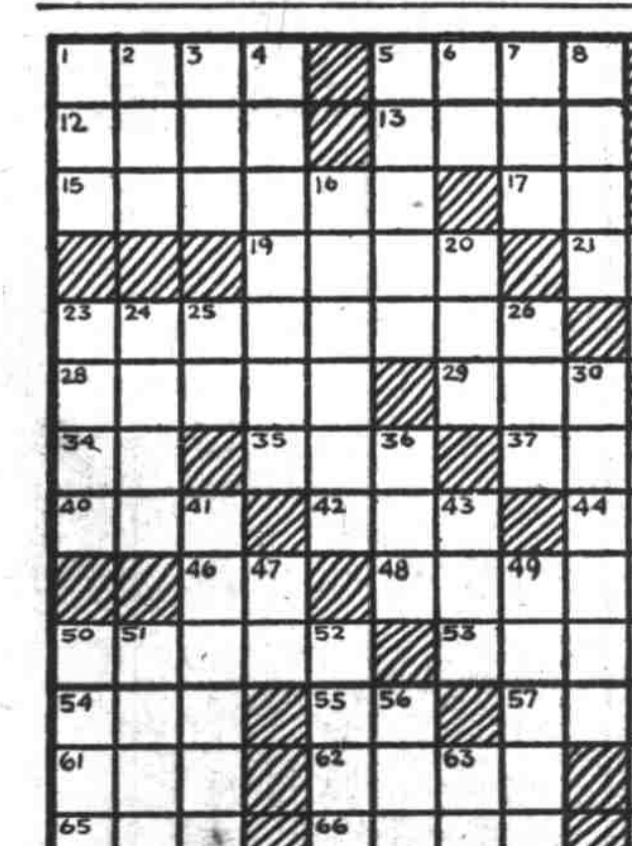
