

Victory Harvest Camp Planned By YMCA Committee for Boys

"Work and Play for Pay" is the theme of the Victory harvest camp, authorized by the Salem YMCA boys' work committee Thursday. The camp will be inaugurated to aid the youth of Salem in earning money and harvesting vital defense crops and at the same time gaining a camping experience, stated Ancil Payne, acting boys' work secretary who will direct the venture.

Not designed to replace the recreational camp at Silver Creek, which is scheduled for the off-season in mid-summer, the harvest camp is planned because of the expected shortage of seasonal labor and the apparent difficulty of transportation.

Tentative plans call for the camp to begin immediately after school vacation starts, and the first work will be done in the

berry fields. However, the larger camp will be operated during the bean season in the late summer.

Closely supervised by YMCA staff members, the camp will incorporate an extensive health and recreation program. Probable cost is \$1 per day per boy. Ages of participants are tentatively set for 12 to 16 years.

An extensive survey will be taken sometime the first of next week, in which parents and students will have the opportunity to designate their interests in the camp. It is to be taken in the junior high schools.

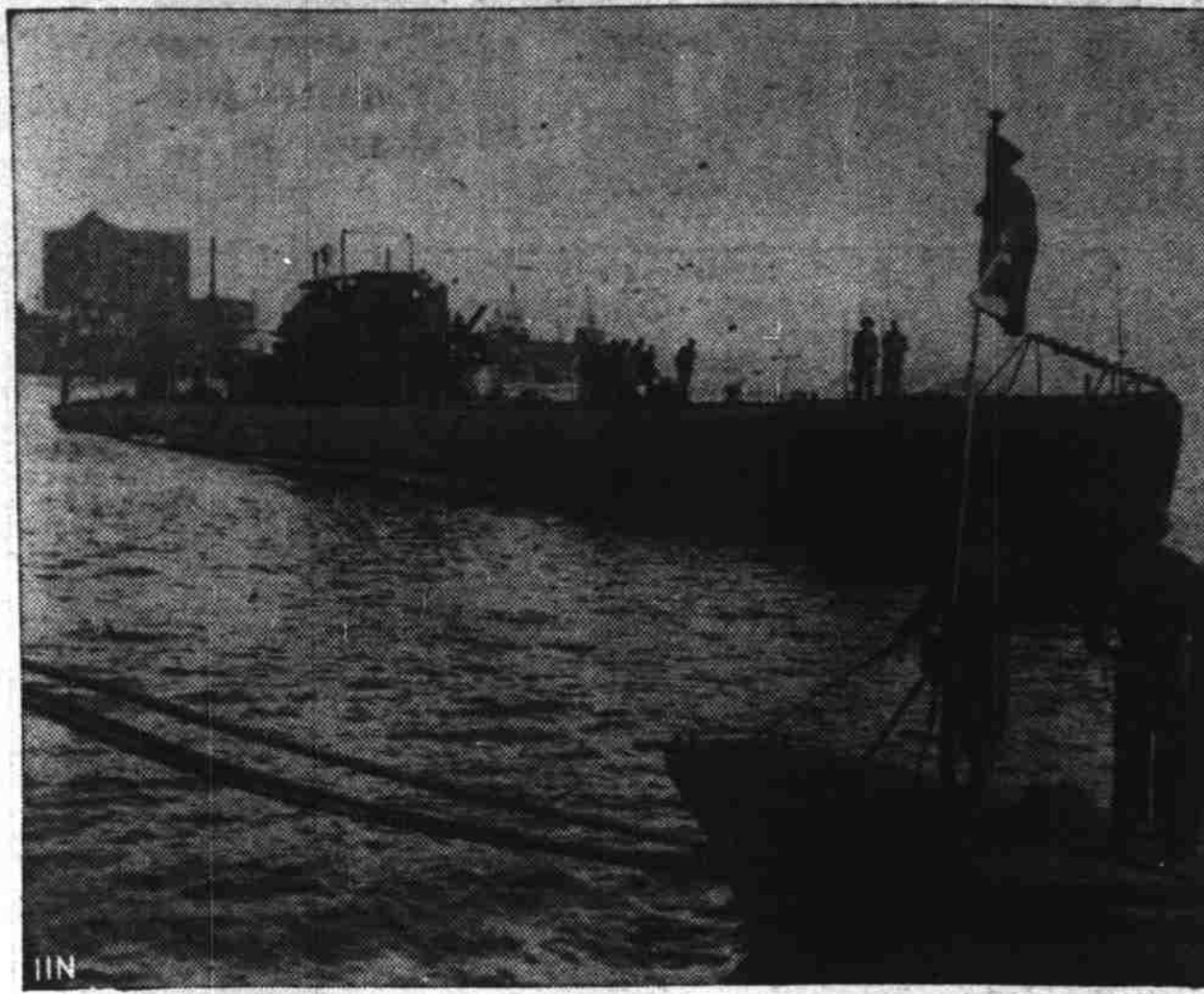
