

Ceiling Set On Prices

Silverton Tire Board Gives Report for Recent Applications

SILVERTON — The Silverton tire rationing board received notice Wednesday that a new ceiling on used tire and tube prices to counteract profiteering is now effective. The prices vary according to the wear and size of the tires, the information states.

During the week ending March 19, four applications were refused by the local tire board and two were deferred. Eleven tires and eight tubes of the quotas 16 and 13 remain in the passenger car list. Tires were granted Peter J. Burger and O. J. Schlottman, Mt. Angel, Edwith Hatteberg, Silverton and Luther-Moore, Mt. Angel. Inspectors were Brenden, Le-gard and Dickman.

In the truck tire division 15 tires and 29 tubes of the quotas 39 and 44 remain. Applications were granted to Carl Sprauer, Mt. Angel, Alex Gartoff and J. V. Johnson, Scotts Mills, and to Leo J. Wellman and Freeman Gatchet, Silverton. Inspectors were Brenden, A. J. Ettlin, Le-gard and Dickman.

In the case of Jacobsen the tire was granted because his was stolen, according to the report made by the local clerk, Walter Geren.

The board reports that those wishing tires and tire information should remember the hours of the clerk, which are from 10 to 12 a.m. and from 1 to 3 p.m., each day at the defense headquarters.
