SAUSAGE CASSEROLE
 1 pound pork sausage links

2 tablespoons water
 2 cups milk
 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
 1/4 cup cornmeal
 1/4 cup shredded bran.
 Six eggs

Place sausage links in cold skillet. Add water, cover and cook until water has evaporated. Remove cover, increase heat and cook until links are browned. Heat milk and add salt. Add cornmeal gradually and cook, stirring until thick. Add the shredded bran and spread mixture in the bottom of a round 8-inch buttered casserole. Arrange browned sausage links on top of the cornmeal mixture like the spokes of a wheel. Carefully break eggs between the links. Cover and place in hot oven (400 degrees F) for ten minutes or until eggs are cooked.

Here's a delectable dessert that's mixed by a new method.

BEE'S PINEAPPLE MERINGUE CAKE

2 1/2 cups flour
 1/2 cup sugar
 3 tablespoons baking powder
 1 cup sugar
 4 unbeat egg yolks
 1/4 cup milk
 1/2 teaspoon lemon extract
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Blend shortening and flour together until like coarse cornmeal and no particles of shortening remain. Add baking powder and sugar and a little over half the milk. Mix well, drop in the yolks, mix again, add rest of milk, flavoring and beat well. Bake in two layers, covering each layer with a meringue made of 4 egg whites, 1/2 cup sugar and flavoring. Top with shredded almonds and bake about 45 minutes at 325 degrees. Spread between layers with 1/4 cup pineapple juice, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 tablespoon butter and 2 tablespoons cornstarch. Cook until thick and add 1/2 cup crushed drained pineapple—may add 1/2 cup whipped cream.
