

Most Stocks Slow Tuesday

Airline Issues Fare Well; Buying Is Reluctant
NEW YORK, April 7—(AP)—While airlines and other specialties gave a fairly good account of themselves in Tuesday's stock market, many leaders failed to extend Monday's recovery bulge.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was off .1 of a point at 34.9. Transfers totaled 308,320 shares against 335,200 Monday.
Action of the civil aeronautics board in granting Continental Air Lines a mail rate boost and agreeing to reconsider the American Airlines rate cut case aided stocks in this division.

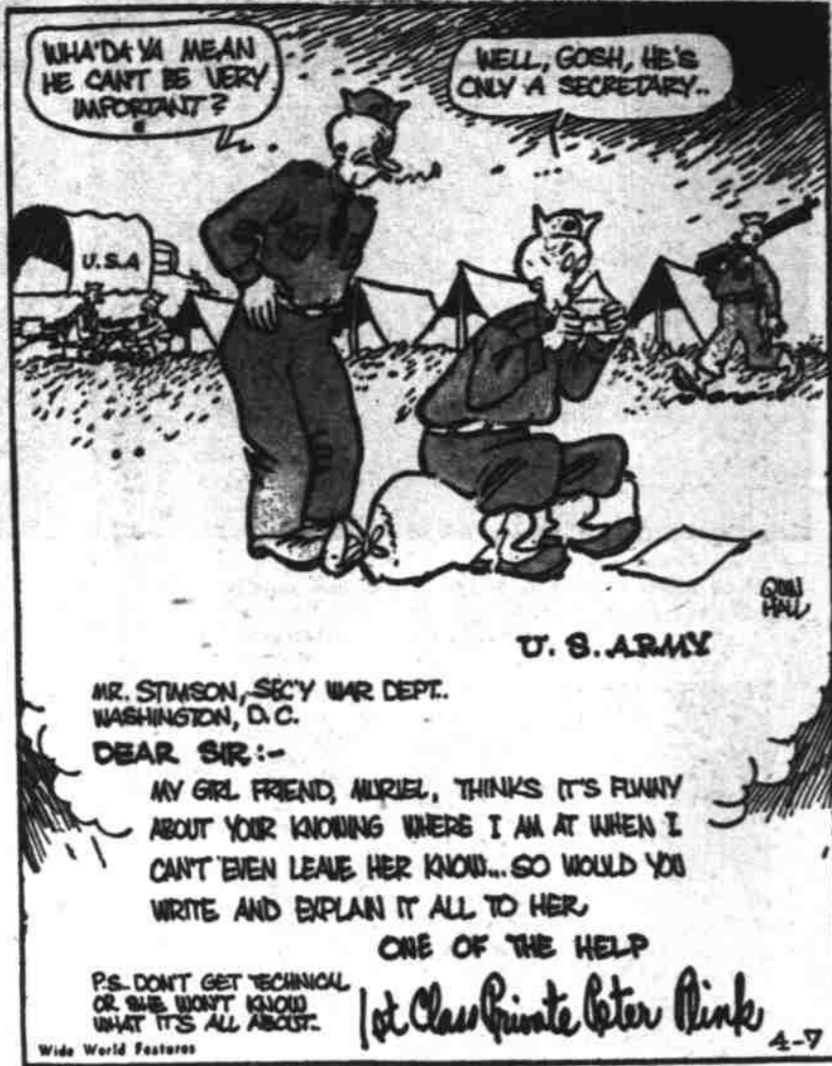
Following official negotiations between Tokyo and the Vatican, protested by both the U. S. and Great Britain, Ken Harada has been appointed a special minister to the Vatican.

State's Industrial Payroll Hits All-Time High in Three Months

Oregon's industrial payroll during the first three months of the war reached an all-time high of \$62,122,601, compared to \$43,733,096, during the corresponding period a year ago, figures released by the state industrial accident commission Tuesday disclosed.
The figures cover the period December 1 to March 1. Multnomah county, where the bulk of the state's industrial plants are located, had a total payroll of \$31,661,399 during the three months. The industrial payroll in Multnomah county during the three months a year ago was \$17,250,730.

Lindow Jerseys Make Record

The seven-cow registered Jersey herd of Mr. and Mrs. John Lindow, Independence, has just completed a national-record herd average of 690.68 pounds of butterfat per cow, according to information wired from the New York office of the American Jersey Cattle club.
The record exceeds the previous national record of 683 pounds held by the Morningside Hospital herd, Gresham, a herd of about eight cows. The Lindow herd average constitutes the highest herd average ever established for any breed, the Jersey bulletin, national breed organ, stated.

Grain Prices Rise Slightly

CHICAGO, April 7—(AP)—Grain prices tried Tuesday to extend Monday's recovery but the attempt was feeble.
Led by corn and oats, which responded to continued gains in the hog market, where prices reached new peaks for the past 16 years, the cereal market showed signs of advancing at times. Corn rose as much as 1/2 cent and oats 1/4 cent, pulling wheat and rye out of an early decline of about 1/2 cent. The bread cereals registered gains of about 1/2 cent at one stage.

Produce Mart Prices

PORTLAND, April 7—(AP)—Radishes were in the heaviest supply of the season on the Farmers' Wholesale market Tuesday, despite the usual Tuesday quiet. The price showed little change, ranging generally 50-55 cents dozen bunches.
Mustard greens, in fair volume, sold quickly at 40 cents dozen bunches.
Cabbage greens were 25 cents dozen bunches.
Local spinach was generally 80 cents orange box and Maryhill was mostly a dime higher.
Rhubarb offerings were liberal and 15-pound boxes sold 50-60 cents.
Cauliflower was 85 cents to \$1 crate for 2s.
