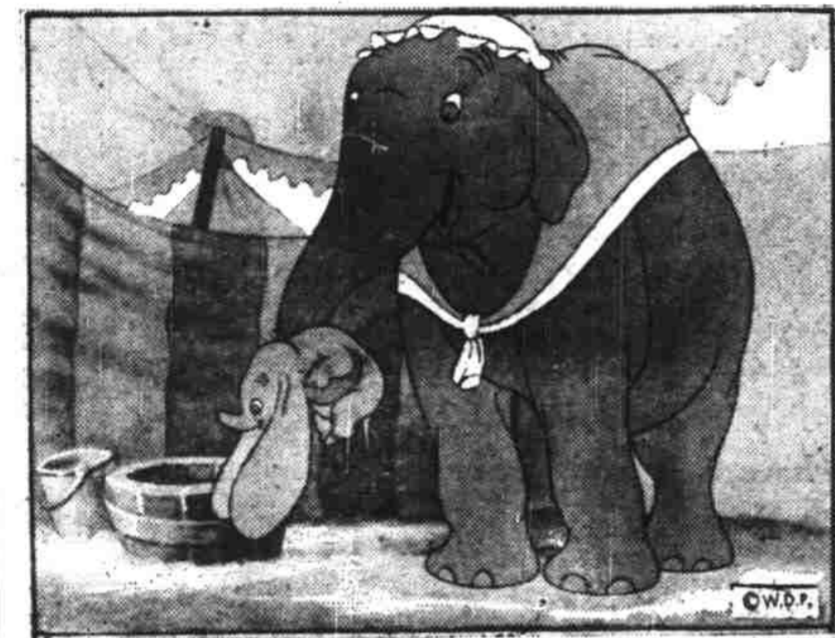
As she and Frankie danced he told her, "Boy, the way you make with your feet, it's like dancing with a puff of wind."
