

**British Find** Fire Pumps Inadequate

The experience of British fire

fighters is revising British ideas

as to the effectiveness of the stir-

rup pump for incendiary bombs.

according to Percy Bugbee, gen-

eral manager of the National Fire Protection association. The stirrup pump is referred to as "time-wasting and laborwasting" in the official journal of the British fire service, "Fire," for March, 1942. Another comment made in this publication is that "The ministry of home security has now come to the conclusion that the necessity for speed in dealing with a number of bombs falling simultaneously on a target and adjoining risks, requires the use of jets and not spray from stirrup pumps. This in itself points to the fact that the stirrup pump-which requires almost as many people to put it to work as a motor pump does-is not speedy enough, especially

when the incendiary bombs are released in large numbers." The fire advisory committee that has been helping the office of civilian defense plan defenses against air attacks has long recognized the limitations of the stirrup pump, according to Mr. Bugbee, and it advises that the relatively few stirrup pumps in existence in this country be used by civilians only where a lack of critical materials makes it impossible to provide pump tank fire extinguishers. 
