Honey Sweetens New Cake

A cake will use honey as the sweetening, just to lengthen out the sugar ration.

HONEY CAKE

2 cups sifted cake flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
¼ teaspoon salt
½ cup shortening
2 egg yolks
1 cup honey
½ cup milk
2 egg whites
1 teaspoon vanilla

Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Cream shortening until light; beat egg yolks lemon colored, gradually adding ¼ cup of the honey while beating. Add the egg-honey mixture to the creamed shortening, creaming while adding. Add sifted dry ingredients alternately with milk, mixing well. Beat egg whites stiff; gradually beat in remaining ½ cup honey until mixture stands in stiff peaks. Fold into cake batter until well blended. Bake in 2 greased 9-inch layer-cake pans in moderate oven (375 degrees) 30 minutes. Cool; frost.
