Made of tough plastic, these "hats" are the inside half of the army's new two-part, double-purpose helmet. The plastic parts, being inspected by Miss Ann Bires, are comfortable to wear and give sufficient protection for behind-the-line activities. Weighing less than 12 ounces and made of cloth and resin, they are tough enough to withstand the force of an 8-pound steel ball dropped from a height of nearly two feet—the army-specified resistant test of 15 foot pounds. An outer steel shell, normally hung from the soldier's belt, is slipped on over the plastic hat, for front-line combat.
