

Leading Stocks Go Downward

Profit Takers Cash In on Last Week; Worse News NEW YORK, July 13—(AP)—Leading stocks edged downward in Monday's market without being subjected to any real selling pressure.

Recent buyers with sizable profits on last week's sharp rally, second best for the year to date, included to cash at least part of them in the wake of more discouraging Russian war news.

Grains Wait On Congress

CHICAGO, July 13—(AP)—Attention of traders in the wheat pit was focused on Washington Monday, where the deadlock on sales of government owned grain for livestock feed remained unchanged, and prices moved within a narrow range in quiet dealings.

Other sections of the market, however, displayed independent strength, with corn pacing an upturn in oats, rye and soybeans. Trading in these pits was also slow.
