BROOKLYN, Aug. 12-(AP)-Lefty Larry French, the National league's leading pitcher, blanked the Philadelphia Phils on four hits to hang up his 12th victory against only one defeat Wednesday as the Brooklyn Dodgers squeezed out a 1-0 decision.

The triumph was something of a gift from French's opponent, Rube Melton, who matched the Brocklyn southpaw's four-hit performance but forced in the winning run in the ninth inning when he walked Dolph Camilli with the bases loaded.

It was the third shutout of the season for French, who leads all active National league pitchers in the whitewash department with 39 for his career.
