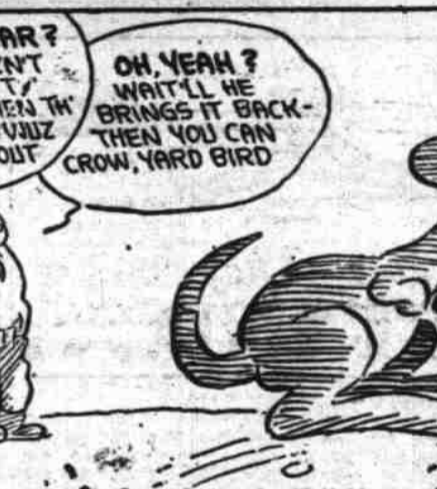

Williams Farm Sold to Bells

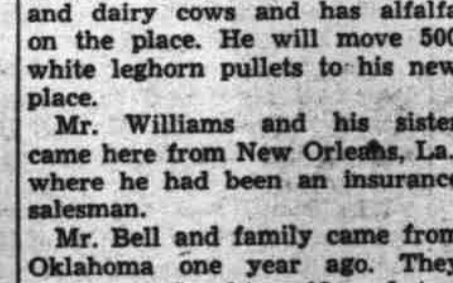
