

The West Africa coup brought 15,000,000 people, 1,815,768 square miles and 50,000 to 60,000 troops with considerable planes and tanks under the Allied banner. Territories include Senegal, French Guinea, French Sudan, the Ivory Coast, Dahomey, Mauretania and Niger.
