

The one at Salem, which was washed out, had been built in 1886. Another one (second one) was built to take its place-the one standing yet.

No great flood at Salem, like the 1860-61 or the 1890 one, ever came excepting after a melting snow. Likely none ever will, especially because of the Willamette river project, which the Eugene people are already saying kept the high water of last ' year there five feet, and is likely doing about the same now. The 1860-61 flood allowed a steamboat at Salem to run to the Marion county court house. An \$8000 fill was put in afterward, piece of work.
