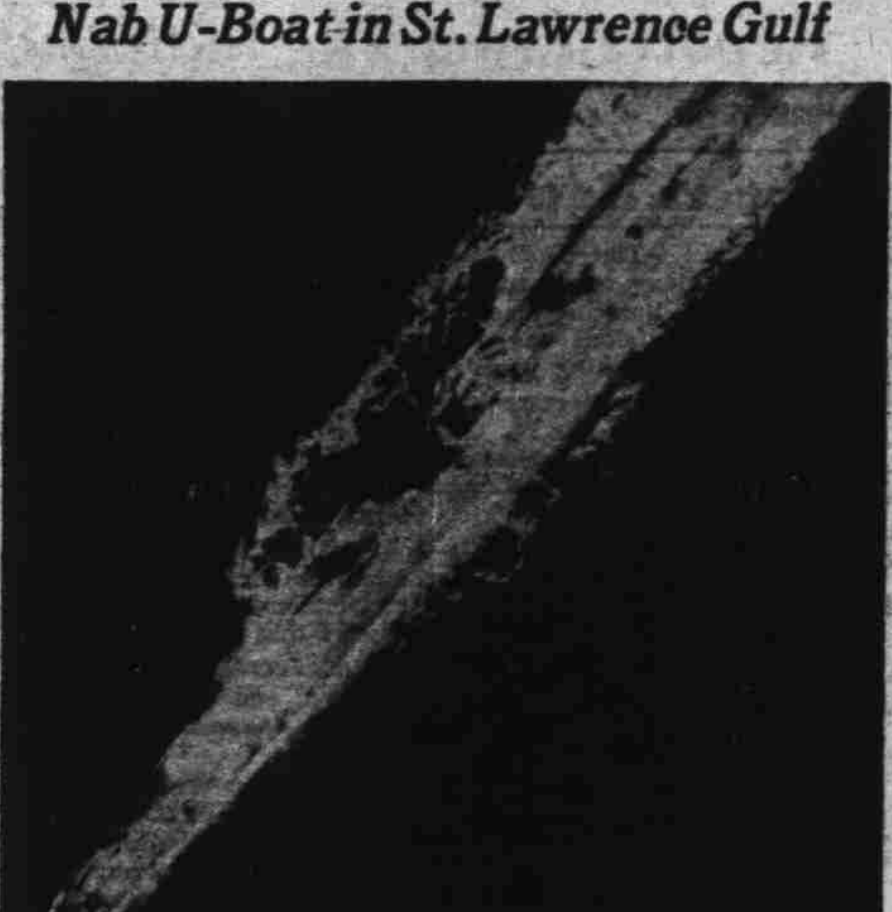
Jefferson High Clubs Organize

Park Cannon To Be Junked

The old Oregon statehouse cannon, a vintage of 1900, is to be accepted for scrap by the United States army, Everett V. Geror, quartermaster's office, Vancouver, Wash., informed Secretary of State Earl Snell while in Salem Friday.

The cannon weighs approximately 8800 pounds and has occupied a conspicuous site on the capitol grounds here for many years. It was offered to the government several months ago by the state board of control.

In turning the cannon over to the army, the government is obligated to replace it with a relic of the current war, when the conflict is concluded.

Whether the cannon will be handled through a scrap dealer or by the army direct has not yet been determined, Geror said.

Code Adopted On Wine Sale

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 18—(AP)—The Oregon liquor control commission closed its December meeting Friday with adoption of a wine code.

The regulations, to become effective January 1, set sanitary standards, prohibit the sale of imitation or synthetic wines, and require that wines must be subjected to laboratory analysis by the commission before being sold in Oregon.

No action was taken governing places of sale.

This step was taken after Commissioner Ernest Fatland of Condon, at a board meeting Friday, criticized present methods of wine sale and regulation. He said in his section a housewife had to go to a beer hall if she wanted to buy light table wine.

Boyd said he believed a reduction in the license fee for light wines might solve the problem. Beer halls don't want to handle anything except fortified wines, he said, and at present grocers can't afford a wine license.

Heavy Trucks Damage Roads

PORTLAND, Dec. 18—(AP)—It cost Oregon \$40,000 to waive its truck weight limit for government builders of Camp Adair, Engineer R. H. Baldock told the highway commission Friday.

That much damage was done pavements, so far the state has not been reimbursed by the federal government.

The commission will press the matter, and, if the money is not paid, will change its policy.

Taken under advisement was a Marion county request that the state take over a 12-mile stretch of the North Santiam highway west of Detroit. The section is difficult to maintain.

Meat Quota Move Seen Little Help

PORTLAND, Dec. 18—(AP)—OPA's authorization for selling January-February-March quota meat as early as December 20 won't mitigate the shortage in Portland much, packers asserted Friday.

This largely because the authorization was accompanied by another order further reducing the meat allotments for those months. In effect, as one packer put it, the orders are like "drawing on next week's pay check when you've received a cut in salary."

Scrap Winners Push 3rd Ship

PORTLAND, Dec. 18—(AP)—Marian Ann Roberts, 10, Fertile Valley, Wash., arrived here Friday night to christen the Liberty ship *Esra Meeker*, Saturday, the third vessel to be launched by a scrap metal contest winners.

Assisting Marian will be Richard McCully, 8, from the Almo school on the Snake river, and Darrell Fowler, 13, from Shaw Island school in the San Juan Islands.

Almo was the winning school in the Washington contest, and Almo teacher, Miss Flora L. Gavin, will deliver the main address. Mrs. Pearl A. Wanamaker, Olympia, state superintendent of public instruction, also will speak. Also attending will be several descendants of Esra Meeker, the pioneer who came to Washington in 1852, retired at the age of 75 and spent the next 20 years in marking and publicizing the Old Oregon Trail. He died in 1928, when 98.

Citizenship was granted 204 Oregon aliens before Federal Judge Claude McCulloch at Portland. . . . The old Wickiup CCC camp will become a conscientious objector camp Saturday with arrival of 78 mid-western Mennonites. They will work on the \$8,400,000 reclamation project. . . . It was twin-week at Portland Sanitarium and Hospital. Supervisor Ruth Gulbranson said twin brother and sister were born Monday, twin girls Tuesday and Wednesday. . . . The program of converting major colleges and universities to training quarters for soldiers will fit readily at Oregon State college, President A. L. Strand said at Corvallis. It emphasizes engineering, chemistry, physics and pre-medicines, all major studies at OSC. . . . At Pendleton, Marvin Bennett, water engineer, was appointed Umatilla county watermaster. . . . Elmer L. Shirrel, Tule Lake Jap relocation project superintendent, disclosed at Klamath Falls that he would take a new assignment in a few days, probably in the mid-west. No successor has been named. . . . A Grants Pass department store advertised 100 pairs of nylon hose. At 7:30 a. m. there was a line at the entrance. Men and women rushed the counter when the store opened at 9. By 9:09 all hose had been sold, said Store Manager F. L. Vannice, "I don't want any more nylon hose!"
