BAKED SPANISH RICE 4 tablespoons fat (bacon suggested)

1/2 cup chopped onions 1/2 cup diced celery 11/2 cups boiled rice 11/2 cups tomatoes 1/2 teaspoon salt

¼ teaspoon pepper ½ cup buttered crumbs

Heat fat in frying pan, add onions, celery, peppers and tomatoes. Simmer five minutes, stirring constantly. Add rice, salt and pepper. Boil a minute and pour into buttered baking dish. Sprinkle with crumbs. Bake 35 minutes in moderate oven.
