Methodists Set Dedication

Culminating Methodism's week of dedication, nearly 8,000,000 members of that denomination will face war-time emergency needs of the church Sunday by making personal rededication of "self, service and substance" in 42,000 churches across the country.

Led by its board of bishops, the Salem Methodist church will receive its dedication offering on Sunday morning throughout America. The denomination is asked for \$1,000,000 in cash over and above its regular gifts for world service. This, an offering of dedication to aid refugee children, Methodist chaplains in their work at home and at the front and to reinforce and stabilize some very needy parishes in South America, China and in the home land which have greatly suffered because of the war.

Dr. J. C. Harrison will preach the sermon on "Waymarks for Doubtful Feet," Dean Melvin H. Geist will lead the choir in singing "At Thy Feet" by Bach, and Corydon Blodgett will be the soloist singing "The Twenty Third Psalm" by Malotte.
