The cautious Fishermen still stayed with their slow stuff and were making it work. Baker wasn't getting near the Astoria hoop at all.

Then suddenly in the middle of the third quarter, the Fishermen cut loose, which was right down Baker's alley. Crandall, Lee and Seeborg meshed for the Finns, Sowers got four points in succession for Baker and added them to Henderson's two on a lay-in to make it 18-17 for Astoria at the quarter.

Lemmon calmly tossed in two free ones to push Baker out front at the start of the last quarter and the Bulldogs were on their way. Miller made it 21-18 with a rebound.

Crandall and Bryant came through at the foul line to close the gap a little as the game got fearfully fast and rough.

But when Ballantyne tossed in another free one to make it 24-20 with only two minutes left, everyone in the place was sure Astoria had finally met her match. Just to make sure, however, Sowers sneaked in for a set-up to make it 26-22 as the house roared and roared. Lee had hit for Astoria before committing his fourth foul.

But by now bedlam had broken loose and the official scorer was the only book in the press box which failed to notice it was Lee's fourth foul. So he stayed right in.

Ballantyne's move of another two-point shot from the side to make it 29-22 with seconds left and in those seconds Lee again scored with Astoria's final two points, which actually shouldn't have counted.

The loss was an unfeeling goodbye present for Astoria's Coach Wally Palmberg. He now leaves for Chapel Hill, NC, and a navy commission. Fact is, he left last night for Astoria and will not see his men in action in their preliminary tussle.

Williams Ends Series, Starts Lenten Talks

The Rev. W. Irvin Williams, pastor of the First Presbyterian church, will conclude his series on the faithful sayings of Paul this Sunday morning with a message entitled "From Death to Life". The message has been prepared for those with troubled hearts facing the possibility of separation from loved ones serving on the war fronts of the world.

The choir will sing the anthem, "O Lord Most Holy" by Franck, and Michael Carolan will sing the offertory solo, "If with All Your Hearts", taken from Mendelssohn's "Elijah".

At 5 o'clock the class for radio instruction in dramatization and script writing will meet in the club room with Jean Sevillier in charge. Voice testings will be given and plans laid for youth participation in the broadcasts of this church.

Christian Endeavor will meet at 6:15 p. m., the intermediate working on a dramatization project, the high school group holding a discussion meeting and the college-business group also discussing the practicability of the ten commandments.

At the night service, Mr. Williams will begin a series of pre-Easter, lenten meditations suggested by Leslie D. Weatherhead's new book, "Personalities of the Passion." The pastor will expand these studies and bring to mind the lives and experiences of those who surrounded the cross. These biographical sketches are designed to help vitalize Easter for the average man and woman as they are true sketches of persons in history. "Calaphas" is the character to be considered this week. Following this message, which will be broadcast over KSLM, the Westminster Church of the Air will present the program entitled "Port of Call Unknown."

Christians Set Easter Series About Cross

A special evangelical emphasis will mark all of the pre-Easter services at the First Christian church, beginning with the morning worship service Sunday. In addition to the Sunday services, seven church night meetings have been planned for each Wednesday, with the worship centering about the theme "Faces About the Cross." Character studies of persons playing a part in the passion of Christ will be given at these Wednesday meetings on the following: Peter, Caiaphas, Pilate, Barabbas, Judas, Mary, and Joseph of Arimathea. A week of preaching, beginning April 18 and continuing until Easter, with messages by the minister, Rev. Dudley Strain, is also a feature of these pre-Easter services.

To inaugurate this series, Rev. Strain will preach Sunday morning on the theme "When I Believe in Christ" and at night on "Living Sacrificially." The choir will contribute to these services by singing music appropriate to the season. The anthem "Let There Be Light" by Adams will be supplemented Sunday morning by a solo, "How Long Wilt Thou Forget Me?" by Oley Speaks, sung by Mrs. Arthur Nye. "The Pastor's Call," a daily radio program maintained by the church, also will be characterized by messages and music centering upon the cross during the coming season.

Members of the church have pledged themselves to seven weeks of visitation, in a campaign directed by the board of deacons, with the committee headed by I. N. Vinson.
