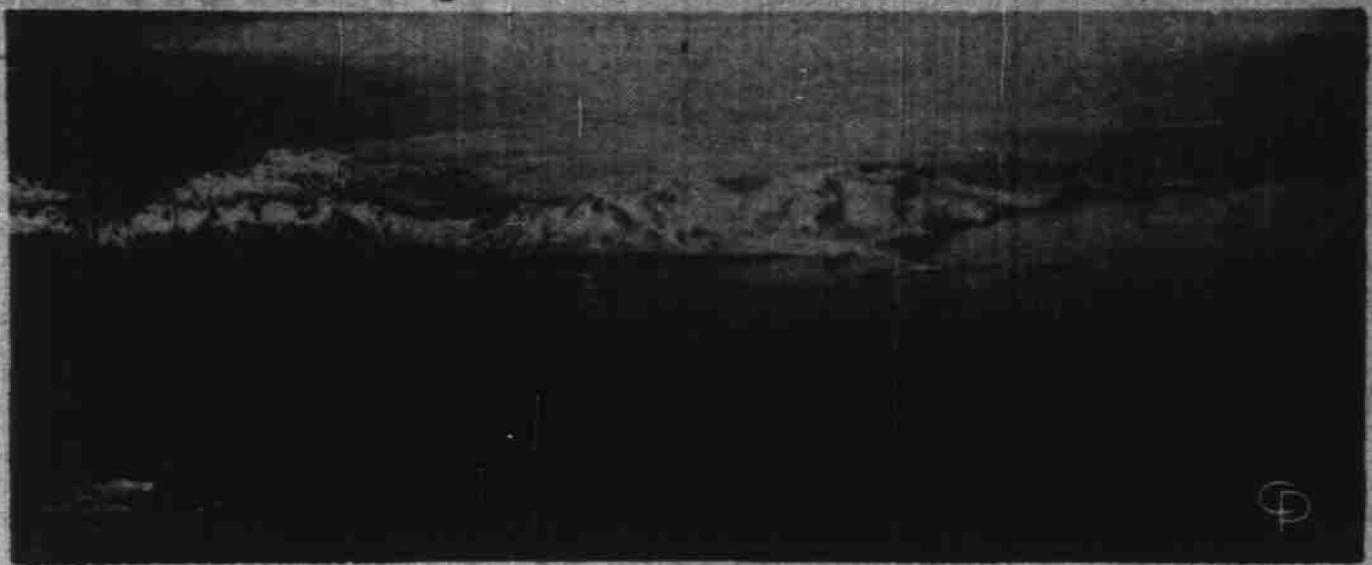
### Food Demonstration To Be Held at Swegle
