# Service Men

## Where They Are—What They Are Doing

Buying 150 chickens from the Arabs is about a three-day job but all the men enjoyed the feast of chicken, bread and wine he was able to provide for while on Saturdays, writes Staff Sergeant Ithel Richard "Dick" Adlard, former Salem boy, from North Africa to Frank McKennon, chief of the division of plant industry for the state department of agriculture. Adlard was employed with the department before entering the service in February, 1941.

"North Africa holds a lot of interest for me if it were not for the war. However, with my job of handling the mess I have been able to see a great deal, particularly the medieval agriculture carried on by the Arabs. They dress the same and live the same as in Bible times," he continues. "Never have I seen any of their animals cut, docked or tagged. They have no conception of selective breeding, either with animals or plants. Of course these Arabs here are sort of a throw-back of the pure Arab who has for centuries kept the blood-lines of the horses pure."

"Occasionally I see some of the true Arabian horses and they really are beautiful. A short time ago I managed to see the sultan and his guards of North Africa as they were closing a three-day fiesta celebration of Allah's birthday (their Christmas). The sultan's horses were all pure Arabian and glistened in the blazing sun. Vendors of all sorts were there selling everything including roasted locust, also water vendors carrying water in the pigskin told about in the Bible.

"We're planning on being home by Christmas of '45," he said, adding the hope that "when we pull the greatest squeeze play in history and give them Germans hell that they never dreamed of, America will not arbitrate."

He also spoke of his interest in the agricultural crops of the south where he was stationed before going overseas, and of the poor and cheap labor there. He mentions that the progressive southern farmers were all enthusiastic over the AAA's green manure crops for which Oregon is growing the seed. He wonders if the Oregon acreage of Austrian peas and hairy vetch is still increasing.

S. Bliss Leslie, former Willamette university student and later employed at the Salem postoffice, who has been attending officers' candidate school at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md., will graduate June 5 with a commission as second lieutenant and will be assigned to Camp Adair, according to word received by Mrs. Leslie.

Among the navy recruits announced from Portland Wednesday were Dean Russel Bigler, Robert Conrad Blensly and Emerson Hough, all of Salem.
