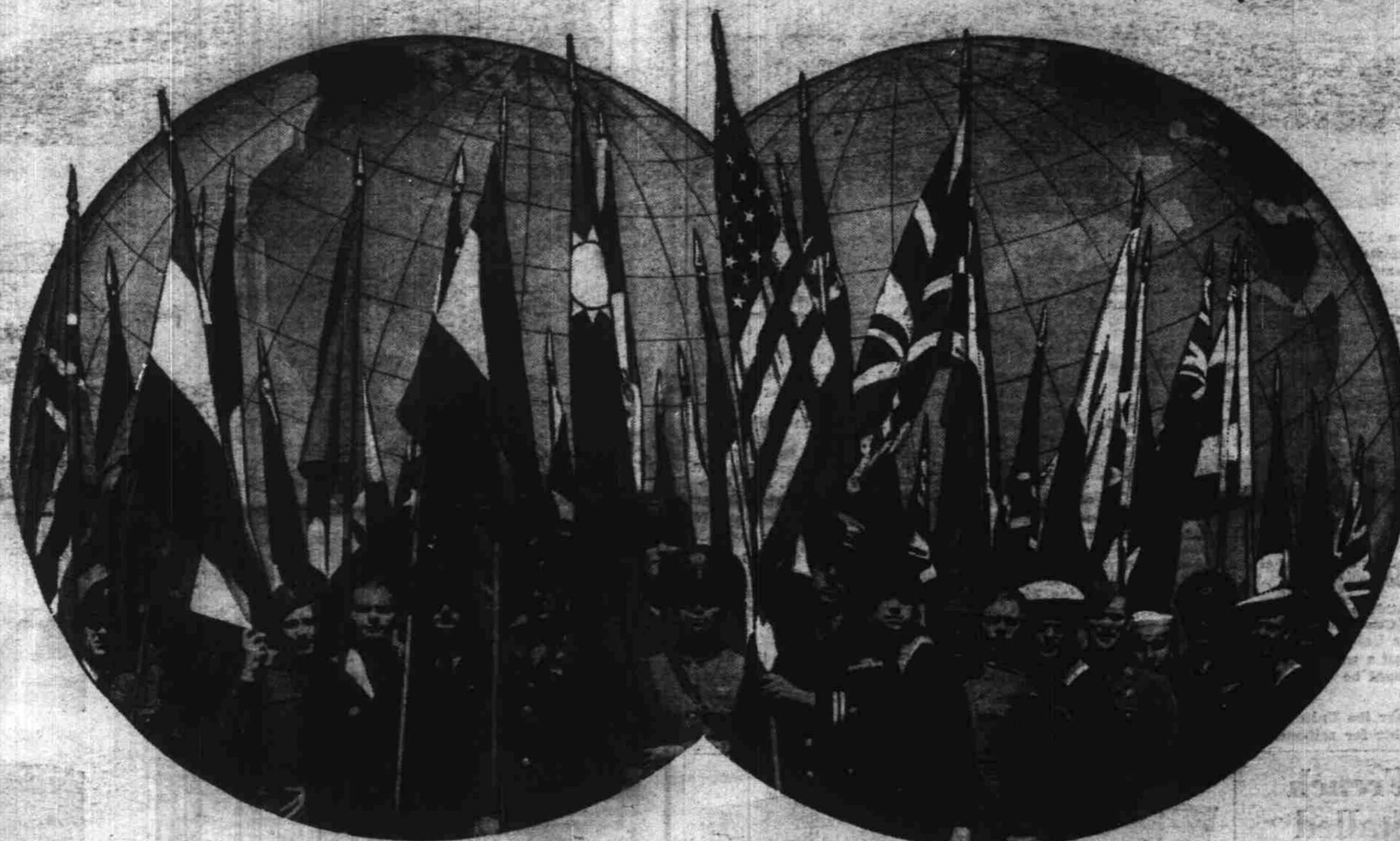

Will Win the "VICTORY" and the "PEACE"

Mark this day on your calendar—for it is one you will long remember: one you will add to those historic dates which you observe faithfully year by year, because they mark the course of our civilization with outstanding significance. This is June 14th: you have observed it before as Flag Day. You have flown Old Glory from your lawn or window, and have taken the children aside to tell them the story of our flag.

But now, June 14th will see many more flags of many more nations unfurled across this land—the flags of all the United Nations with whom we fight for freedom. And you will have a new stride in history to interpret for the children.

You will tell them how, in August 1941, the President of our land and the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland met somewhere at sea and how from that

meeting the Atlantic Charter was created . . . and you will tell them that this Atlantic Charter then became the foundation for a Declaration by United Nations . . . 26 at first, to which more were added as they were able to create their own fighting forces against fascism.

"Complete victory over freedom's enemies . . . in defense of life, liberty, independence and religious freedom, and to preserve human rights in their own lands as well as in other lands."

These words tell for what purpose the United Nations now fight as one. Their teamwork will win the war; for they are united in militance. Their teamwork will win the peace; for their objective is the welfare of every liberty loving man, woman and child around the globe!
