

Grain Pit Prices Sway

Wheat Lower, Oats Unchanged, Rye Takes Slump

CHICAGO, July 8.—(AP)—In a session of wide price movements and rapid changes in trend, grains closed Thursday mixed.

The market took its cue from Washington, where legislative developments on corn ceilings and subsidies followed one another in rapid succession as congress prepared to recess until next September.

At the close wheat was 1/4-3/4 lower, July \$1.47 3/4-1/2; September \$1.48 1/4-1/2; oats were 1/4 lower to 1/4 higher, July 71 1/4, and rye was 1/4 lower to 1/4 higher, July \$1.13.

The market soared higher in response to senate passage late Wednesday of a measure to increase the corn ceiling from \$1.06 to \$1.40 a bushel.

An additional bullish stimulus during this period was the action of the food distribution administration in suspending the export wheat and flour subsidy program.
