here!***

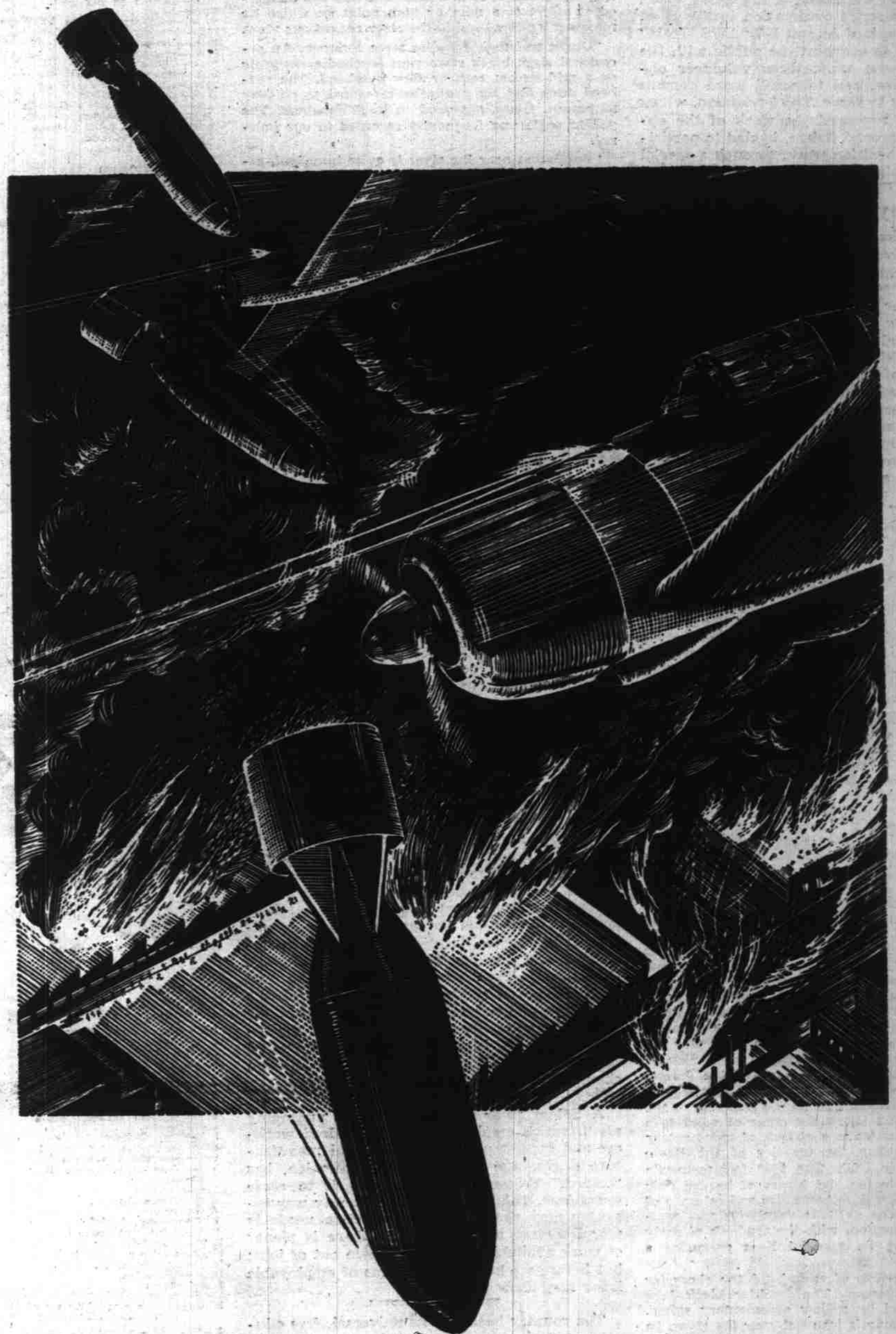

By way of "Shangri La" our own pilots made the trip to Tokio . . . the return trip is no farther for Tojo's pilots. That's why you are needed to KEEP THIS AREA ALERT. Sign up for volunteer Aircraft Warning Service. The Aircraft Warning Corps, Staff Filter Centers, the Ground Observer Corps—eyes and ears of the IV Fighter Command—maintains hundreds of strategically located observation posts . . . posts which must be manned every hour of the day, every day of the week. There are posts where you can serve . . . and play a vital part in the defense of your own home and family.

HERE IS WHAT YOU CAN DO—

- 1** SERVE AS A VOLUNTEER "OBSERVER" AT ONE OF THE ARMY'S OBSERVATION POSTS. During your weekly shift, you will report every aircraft sighted to the Army Filter Board for identification by authorities.
- 2** ARRANGE TO MAKE IT POSSIBLE FOR OTHERS TO FULFILL THEIR DUTIES, even if you cannot serve as an observer yourself. Volunteer to care for the children of observers while they are manning their posts.
- 3** Contact your local Chief Observer and tell him you want to assist in the vital work of the Aircraft Warning Service.
