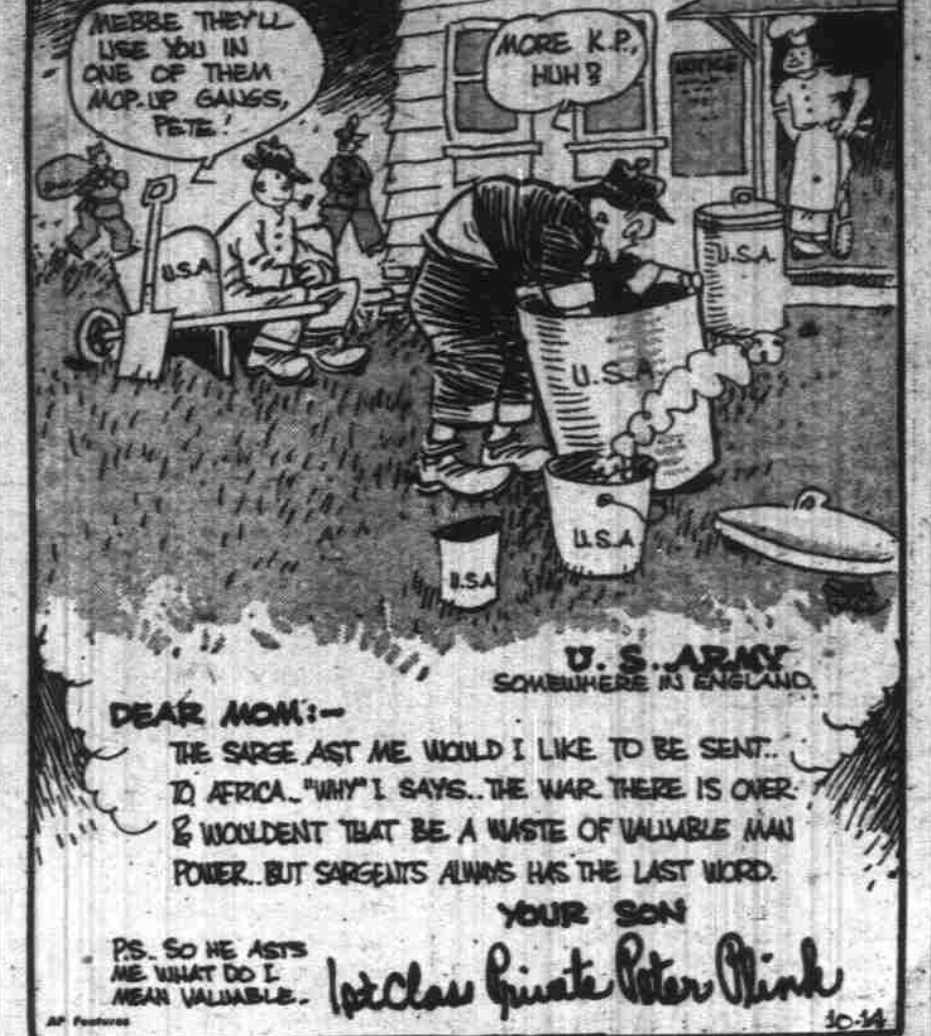
Graveside Rite Held at Dayton For Rev. Post

Rev. Post was born June 10, 1853, at Elizabeth, N.Y. When ten years of age he moved to Crisco, Iowa, with his parents and entered the Methodist ministry in northern Minnesota. He came to Oregon in 1885 and served many churches until he retired ten years ago. He died Friday at Baker. Funeral services were held at Newberg.

Rev. Post was married to Miss Alice E. Jones at Crisco in 1875. Six children were born. Mrs. Post died more than 20 years ago. The four children surviving are James of Newberg, Mrs. Ruby Bahrens of Baker, Asa H. at Chelan, Wash., and Mrs. Bertha Roberts of Yakima.

Salem Heights Fair To Be Friday Night

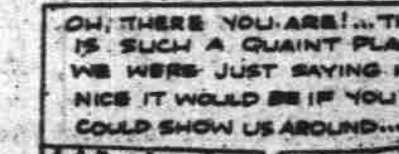
